Dear Distributor,

This letter intends to inform you that Ambu has created a temporary delivery stop for Ambu® King LTS-D™ Disposable Laryngeal Tube, sizes 0, 1, 2 and 2½ in the U.S., due to concerns raised by the FDA on the regulatory pathway that King Systems, which is the manufacturer, has chosen for these sizes.

During the past 5 years, Ambu has sold more than 190 thousand Ambu® King LTS-D™ Disposable Laryngeal Tube, sizes 0, 1, 2 and 2½. During this time, no market feedback or complaint recordings indicate a compromise of product safety of any of the affected products. However, in order to respect the process initiated by the FDA, Ambu and King Systems deem it necessary to stop any further marketing and sale efforts of these sizes for children/pediatric until full clarity has been achieved.

Therefore, we also ask you to remove any marketing material you may have available relating to these sizes, until the situation has been clarified with the FDA.

We also ask you to inform users of sizes 0, 1, 2 and 2½ of the need to identify appropriate airway alternatives. We have attached end user communication, which can be used for this purpose.

The adult sizes 3, 4, and 5 of Ambu® King LTS-D™ Disposable Laryngeal Tube remain available for purchase and can be used for the intended purpose, also in the US.

For now, it is unknown when Ambu will resume delivery in the U.S., as it depends on the outcome of the dialogue with the FDA and the subsequent regulatory path forward.

Please note that Ambu® King LTS-D™ Disposable Laryngeal Tube, sizes 0, 1, 2 and 2½ for children, continue to be available for sale outside U.S. based on regulatory clearances in those markets.

  - a. Welcome to Nicole Grover the new TPM at Research Medical Center
- II. Update from the State

Nicole Gamm gave the update from the state.

- a. The TCD public portal has been launched. The link is below. Nicole gave a walk-through of the website.

- III. TXA Dosing
  - a. Dr. Andrews requested that this committee discuss TXA dosing.
    - i. Dr. Neel said he defers to his blood bank and their pharmacy about dosing. The trauma orders for TXA is 2 Gms as one dose. Research and Saint Luke's is doing the same. The pediatric centers are doing 15 mg/kg up to 1 Gm for 15 years and under.
    - ii. SAC Pediatric Subcommittee Report – Liz Kendrick reported the committee is looking at how the age group of 15-17 are transported. They are wanting to get metrics from the adult trauma centers about this age group. The group felt this would be a good discussion. Liz said that there will be more to come after the Pediatric Subcommittee discusses it a little more. Nicole said the state would be able to help with some data from the EMS Elite data. David said that many of the pediatric patients don't come by ambulance, so it would be helpful to have both EMS and hospital data.
- IV. Trauma Education
  - a. Upcoming education was put in the chat for all to see.
- V. Injury Prevention Project / Performance Improvement
  - a. Kayla Whitaker updated about a possible TQIP Collaborative. She said the cost is based off of the number of hospitals and the trauma level of the hospitals. There is an initial set up fee and an annual fee. She said the participating facilities would get a shared report. A report across whoever is in the collaborative. Each center would be benchmarked only against the centers included in the collaborative. Kayla said there are two structures. One is made up of only Adult Level I & II centers or Pediatric Level I & II centers. The fee is based off the number of centers in the collaborative with a minimum of 3 hospitals and no max. They have a 3<sup>rd</sup> party collaborative. The 3<sup>rd</sup> party is invoiced and the hospitals pay that collaborative party. There is a fee of \$5,000 if there are 3-5 hospitals participating. If 6-10 participating hospitals it is \$10,000, 11-24 is \$15,000, and 25 and over is \$20,000. She said the benefits are risk adjusted outcomes, system level quality improvement, education, and identification of best practices. You receive a semi annual report.
  - b. Liz Day emailed information from Arkansas and the cost was \$18,000. It was unclear if this was per facility or total.
