The meeting was called to order at approximately 12:30 pm. Self-introductions were completed.

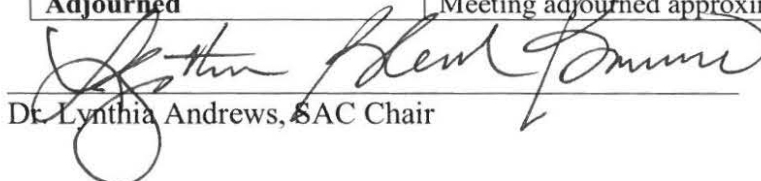

<p>Patricia Casey, Vice Chair</p>	<p>and Peds meetings. Liz is overseeing the EMSC grant. Safe transport of children in back of ambulances has been named as a priority. A flier for EMS has been developed and will be distributed when children are brought in by ambulance.</p> <p>In an effort to have best practices for MO to be considered, the group may bring the ‘ambulance stickers’ back for display when appropriate equipment etc. for pediatric patients is on board.</p> <p>Special needs standard form has been further discussed. It has been recognized that sometimes the form would not be appropriate because treatment changes are dynamic.</p>	<p>steer the committee to include the statewide Special Medical Needs Form.</p>	
<p>B. Trauma Subcommittee Dr. David Gustafson, Chair</p>	<p>Dr. Gustafson reporting Trauma and Reg A have overlapping issues. Patient reports from and to hospitals discussed. NEMESIS 3 will be ready by end of 1st quarter at state level, but problems for EMS/Hospitals to get data will still exist. Dr. Gustafson would like hospitals to be able to access the MOSTORM data.</p> <p>The trauma subcommittee will submit a letter to SAC/Dr. Andrews to ask for data back from DHSS. Iowa uses Image Trend and has a good list of data points and trauma data analysis—it could be used by MO as a model to copy. Examples are age distribution, primary vs secondary transfers, zip codes of fatalities, preventable causes of death. One reason that MO has incomplete data is because some hospitals have national accreditation and can’t access image trends. Trauma needs funding to have accessible statewide data.</p> <p>Many institutions have no idea MOSTORM exists or what it is for.</p> <p>Terry Ellsworth recognized there is a disconnect in getting data when the hospital is designated by other than the state. However, Terry can designate a person to have access to the bridge to Image Trends.</p> <p>HDE is a portal that allows information flow between hospital and EMS, controlled by hospital.</p> <p>Leeann Johnson asked is there one repository for data to be stored for access by receiving hospital. Terry said that is the goal.</p> <p>Dr. Gustafson noted the new year has started and still no trauma regs released by the state. He says if the hold-up is lack of experts, this subcommittee can fill the room.</p>

E. Air Ambulance Subcommittee Ruby Mehrer, Chair	Ruby Mehrer reported the Air Ambulance subcommittee met this morning before SAC with Rep. John Wiemann in his office. Discussion centered around Rep. Wiemann's desire to avoid balance billing for patients transported by air. Air ambulance representatives reviewed the progress made in the last year, including Anthem having signed agreements Air Methods and Air Evac on reimbursement. Wiemann indicated bills have already been filed to force air ambulance to accept 'in network' payments. In addition, bills have been filed to exempt air ambulances from getting direct payment from the insurance companies. Solutions are actively being sought. Follow up meetings will be requested.

Old Business	<p>Jason White reported the MO Interstate Compact committee hasn't met recently. The National committee isn't scheduled to meet until later in the spring.</p> <p>Mark Alexander reported on the TCD state committee meetings: Reqs and rules subcommittee is meeting every two weeks There is agreement that all hospitals in Missouri need to participate in the TCD system. Reqs need to be broad enough to allow dynamic changes in patient care. Hospitals designations should be TCD Centers that would be broad enough to include new TCD diseases like sepsis.</p> <p>Helen Sandkuhl noted urgent care centers are popping up and licensing requirements are different from hospitals. She wants verbiage in the TCD system that will address the urgency of getting TCD patients to a TCD hospital.</p> <p>Dr. Andrews reviewed the initial TCD discussions. 782 people put TCD together in the beginning and Dr. Andrews doesn't want it to go away. Dr Andrews asked Helen Sandkuhl to determine what needs to be reported on TCD from the regions so she can report to SAC. Dr. Andrews wants to have good patient outcomes and she believes TCD Regional input is needed to be able to measure outcomes. She believes is well represented and appreciates Terry Ellsworth's help. She said she wants lines of communication open to keep everyone up to date.</p>
