A Method for Improving the Delivery of Person Centered Care & Improving Quality of Life

Dementia Care Mapping (DCM) is a method to evaluate the delivery of person centered care and, in general, to improve the quality of care delivered to persons with dementia in formal care settings. DCM goes to the real heart of caring by striving to assess care from the viewpoint of the person with dementia. It involves making and recording detailed observations. DCM provides valuable, clear and reliable information for those concerned with quality care for people with dementia. After the data is analyzed, immediate feedback can be given to care partners so that existing practices can be analyzed and improved. Feedback is done in a way that supports care partners and their improvement ideas. Careless or demeaning care practices and particularly sensitive care practices are highlighted without identifying information about involved care partners.

Who Should Attend?

Instructors

Trainers for this session are the only two currently authorized trainers of the DCM method in the United States. Their training was conducted by instructors from the Bradford Dementia Group, Bradford University, England (founders of the DCM movement). Jentle Harts Consulting now serves officially as lead trainers for DCM in the USA. Both instructors have been Basic mappers since 1999. In 2000 they obtained Advanced Mapping status and in 2001 became Evaluators which entitles them to use the method for research. In 2004 they completed all the requirements set by Bradford Dementia Institute of Bradford University, Bradford, England and the International DCM Advisory Board to become trainers of the DCM Basic Level course. They completed requirements to teach the Advanced DCM course in 2010. Both instructors are national presenters on person centered care, culture change, leadership skills and other dementia care topics. Jentle Harts offers training and consultation for organizations wishing to implement or enhance person centered care and DCM.

Apprentice Instructor

De Minner, RN, has been using DCM in Missouri homes since taking the Basic DCM User course in 2003. She became an advanced Mapper in 2004 and achieved DCM Evaluator status through the University of Bradford in 2005. She has been in and around Missouri nursing homes since 1994, first as a LTC nurse manager/director and then as part of the MU-Sinclair School of Nursing QIPMO & PRIMARIS programs. She is now associate faculty for the MU-RN & NHA Enhanced Leadership Development Academy in the St Louis area.

Course Outline

The three-day course facilitates participants becoming thoroughly familiar with the method and theory of DCM. The interactive classes inspire confidence in attendees who will be able to immediately apply their learning in practical ways.

There will be an examination on the final day. **Participants should bring a calculator and pencils.**

Participants will receive a Certificate on successful completion of the examination. **19.0 CEU's** are available for social workers and health facility administrators.
