Celebrating Creativity in Elder Care Workshop

FACILITATED BY **GARY GLAZNER**

This workshop will enhance professional practice, values, skills, and knowledge by identifying key issues related to communicating with people living with Alzheimer's disease and related dementia and to explore how the arts may address these issues. This workshop provides an introduction to using poetry with people living with memory loss and explores strategies for creating and performing poems, songs, stories, and movement inspired by art.

This course is recommended for social workers, counselors, museum staff, teaching artists, family members, and therapists and is appropriate for beginning and intermediate levels of practice.

GARY GLAZNER is the founder and Executive Director of the Alzheimer's Poetry Project (APP). The APP was the recipient of the 2013 Rosalinde Gilbert Innovations in Alzheimer's Disease Caregiving Legacy Award. *PBS News Hour*, NBC's *Today* show, and NPR's "All Things Considered" have featured segments on Glazner's work. Glazner is the host and co-producer with New York Memory Center of the monthly Memory Arts Café, a series of free art events for people living with Alzheimer's disease, their caregivers, and the general public. He is the author of *Dementia Arts: Celebrating Creativity in Elder Care*, published by Health Professional Press, 2014. Glazner is the founder of the Institute for Dementia Education and Arts (IDEA). Glazner holds a B.A. in Expressive Arts from Sonoma State University.
