

Dr. Mei Lin completed her MD and MPH in Child and Adolescent Hygiene from the Beijing Medical University in China. She also holds a Master of Science in Epidemiology from the University of Ottawa in Canada. She joined the CDC Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Epidemiology (EPI) Program in 2008, as the new MCH EPI assignee for the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. To enhance epidemiological capacity at the state level, she has provided a pivotal role in several MCH projects such as the Missouri MCH Needs Assessment, Missouri pilot PRAMS report, and utilization of data linkage to inform MCH program planning and evaluation.

Prior to becoming an assignee, Dr. Lin served as the lead biostatistician with the Office of Epidemiology at the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. She provided epidemiologic and statistical consultation and support on a wide variety of epidemiologic projects, such as the State of Missouri's Health Report, Falls Prevention Initiative for Seniors and the National HIV Behavioral Surveillance Survey for Injection Drug Users in Missouri.

Dr. Lin has served as author or co-author on 20 articles in peer-reviewed journals, such as Am J Epidemiol, J Epidemiol Comm Health, Environ Health Perspect, and Pediatrics.
