- Russ Drury is the Director of the Laboratory Preparedness, Education and Safety Unit at the Missouri State Public Health Laboratory. He is the current liaison for Sentinel Laboratories who identify select agents and must submit documentation required by the Select Agent Program.

This 90 minute webinar will introduce Sentinel Clinical laboratories to the roles and responsibilities assigned by the Federal Select Agent Program. Facilities must know who to contact, when to refer specimens for confirmation, and what forms must be completed when a potential biological agent or toxin on the Select Agent registry is identified in their facility. This intermediate-level program is designed for managers, supervisors, safety professionals and laboratorians working in clinical laboratories where potential select agents may be identified.
