#### **OMH Updates**

- The legislature has convened a committee on how Missouri can expand Medicaid and come up with an agreement. Sen. Jamilah Nasheed was placed on the committee. Rep. Karla Mays is hosting meetings in the St. Louis area.
- The Missouri Legislative Black Caucus Foundation is hosting an annual conference in St. Louis this week, July 11-12, 203 at the Renaissance Hotel. Sen. Kiki Curls is forming a Health Forum and one of the panelists is Dr. Delores Gunn. The program will be sent to the membership.
- OMH has hired two staff, Idalia McNulty (Health Program Representative III) and Nivedita Sundararajan (Project Specialist). Idalia will work specifically with the Hispanic population, and Nivedita will focus on evidence based

• *Healthy Brain Conference* –OMH partnered with the Alzheimer's Association and the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. The conference took place on April 20, 2013 and was well attended with good speakers and informative exhibits.

- Older Americans Month OMH helped sponsor Bringing It Together with Ms. Ollie Mae Stewart. The event was successful with approximately 800 seniors in attendance. Local and State officials also attended. There was a 101 year old lady that was dancing. She has never had a health issue in her life. Her secret is daily exercise.
- *African Arts Festival* OMH sponsored the Health Village which offered more physical activities and presentations. Mr. Palm helped put on a boxing presentation with a teenage boxer and her coach. ### **Lincoln University Senior Lay Leaders**

A new contract has been signed with Lincoln University – Paula J. Carter Center on Minority Health and Aging. One of the required deliverables is to have 15 Senior Lay Leaders in every area of Missouri. The contract also includes hosting MIMA (Missouri Institute on Minority Aging) which provide seniors with information and interact on issues seniors face. This will be the third year applicants can be nominated as King and Queen. There are criteria that applicants must meet. The crowned King and Queen will participate in Lincoln University's Homecoming and will become one of the Senior Lay Leaders. The Regional Alliance Chairs will attend MIMA next year.
