World Hepatitis Day — July 28th

On World Hepatitis Day, July 28,2015, WHO and partners will urge policy-makers, health workers and the public to act now to prevent infection and death from hepatitis.

Viral hepatitis is inflammation of the liver caused by a virus. Viral hepatitis – a group of infectious diseases known as hepatitis A, B, C, D, and E – affects hundreds of millions of people worldwide, causing acute and chronic liver disease and killing close to 1.5 million people every year, mostly from hepatitis B and C.

These infections can be prevented, but most people don't know how. With better awareness and understanding of how we can prevent hepatitis we can eliminate this disease and save 4,000 lives a day.
