### National Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Breast cancer is a group of diseases that affects breast tissue. Both women and men can get breast cancer, though it is much more common in women.

Other than skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common cancer among women in the United States, accounts for one-third of all cancers diagnosed in Missouri, and is the leading cause of cancer deaths in women after lung cancer. Nearly all breast cancers can be treated successfully if detected in the earliest stages, with the cure rate being 97 percent.



Some women are at higher risk for breast cancer due to personal or family medical history, but the biggest risk of a breast cancer diagnosis is being a woman and getting older. Ninety-five percent of new cases and 97 percent of breast cancer deaths occur in women aged 40 and older.

That is why screening by mammography, clinic breast examination, and breast self-examination, is so important to find breast cancer early, which can lower the risk of deaths.

## Delta States Rural Development Network Grant

**CONGRATULATIONS to <u>two Missouri communities</u>** for receiving the US Department of Health and Human Service's (HHS), Delta States Rural Development Network Grant Program funding grant.

The Delta States Rural Development Network Grant Program (Delta) grants were awarded to 12 rural communities in the eight Delta States focusing on topics such as diabetes, cardiovascular diseases, obesity, and acute ischemic stroke.

Each grantee will receive up to \$945,000/year for a three-year project period in order to address unmet local health needs and prevalent health disparities in Delta communities. Delta Program projects provide an opportunity to address a broad range of challenges unique to rural communities by emphasizing efforts around chronic diseases and focusing on population health. With Federal Office of Rural Health Program's, these organizations will work towards being sustainable beyond the three-year project period, achieving long-term outcomes such as demonstrating an improvement in health status and showing a reduction in unnecessary emergency department encounters due to chronic disease. These funded organizations are helping to change how health care is being delivered in rural communities.
