



PURPOSE

To increase awareness impact of injury and violence on children, provide strategies to advocate for children and build resiliency through injury, abuse and violence prevention. This bi-state initiative, designed for and by child safety advocates, focuses on the latest information related to unintentional and intentional childhood and adolescent injuries.



TARGET AUDIENCE

Nurses, social workers, public health professionals, child care providers, emergency personnel, law enforcement and other advocates for infants and children.



OBJECTIVES

- Describe the identified community needs of the KC metro area based on assessment and data.
- Explain how the trauma informed care can build resiliency in children, teens, families and health care workers.
- Discuss approaches to the assessment for risk of suicide in children and teens.
- Explore strategies to identify (and defuse) escalating mental health situations.
- Discuss initiatives to reduce nicotine/tobacco use in teens and young adults.
- Engage in discussion to promote safe sports participation.
- Identify the current initiatives for addressing the challenges of transporting children safely.
- Create change by actively engaging in injury prevention advocacy and education.
