Program Summary

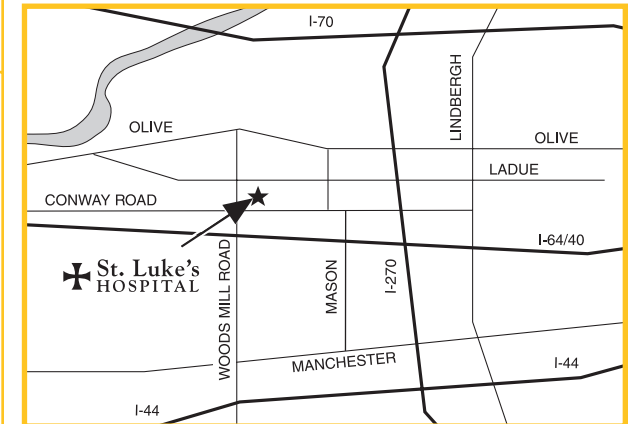
