The order is stored until it is downloaded on either the 15th or 28th of each month at 6:00 a.m. NOTE: If the order is submitted before 6 am on the 15th it will be downloaded on the 15th; if it is downloaded before 6 am on the 28th it will be downloaded on the 28th.
