

Qualifications

Children are eligible to receive free vaccines before their 19th birthday who:

- are Medicaid-eligible; or
- do not have health insurance; or
- are an American Indian or Alaskan Native; or
- are underinsured.

All vaccines are free through the VFC program. However, parents may be charged a small fee by the provider's office for an office visit and each immunization.

Underinsured children may receive VFC vaccines at a deputized Local Public Health Department or a Federally Qualified Health Center or Rural Health Clinic. Contact your Local Public Health Department to find out if they are a deputized provider.

Underinsured does not include those with an unmet deductible or who are unable to pay the deductible. Talk to your doctor if you are unable to pay the fee.
