

NOTICE TO ALL SERVICES AND TRAINING ENTITIES
SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS
April, 2014

As indicated below, Missouri Law and Regulation requires the Bureau of EMS to inspect before a license or accreditation is issued. Before an inspection can be initiated, the Bureau of EMS must receive a "complete" application from the service or entity. Starting immediately, the Bureau of EMS will send electronic notifications, by email, to each service or entity 120 days prior to the expiration of their license or accreditation. The service or entity should immediately submit their application so the inspection process can be started. It is important to assure that the Bureau has a current and correct email address (required on the application) for your service or entity. THE BUREAU WILL NOT INSPECT UNTIL A COMPLETE APPLICATION IS RECEIVED AND NO LICENSE OR ACCREDITATION WILL BE ISSUED UNTIL THE INSPECTION IS COMPLETED AND THE SERVICE OR ENTITY IS DETERMINED TO BE COMPLIANT WITH STATE STATUTE AND REGULATION.

19 CSR 30-40.308 Application and Licensure Requirements Standards for the Licensure and Relicensure of **Air Ambulances**

- (1) Application Requirements for Air Ambulance Service Licensure.
 - (A) Each applicant for an air ambulance service license or relicensure shall submit an application for licensure to the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Bureau no less than thirty (30) days or no more than one hundred twenty (120) days prior to their desired date of licensure or relicensure.

19 CSR 30-40-308 Application and Licensure Requirements Standards for the Licensure and Relicensure of **Ground Ambulance Services**

- (1) Application Requirements for Ground Ambulance Service Licensure.
 - (A) Each applicant for ownership of an ambulance service license or relicensure shall submit an application for licensure to the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) no less than thirty (30) days or no more than one hundred and twenty (120) days prior to their desired date of licensure or relicensure.

190.131. 1. The department shall accredit or certify **training entities for first responders, emergency medical dispatchers, emergency medical technicians-basic, emergency medical technicians-intermediate, and emergency medical technicians-paramedic, for a period of five years, if the applicant meets the requirements established pursuant to sections 190.001 to 190.245.**

19 CSR 30-40.331 Application and Accreditation or Certification Requirements for **Training Entities that Conduct Training for First Responders, Emergency Medical Dispatchers, Emergency Medical Technicians-Basic, Emergency Medical Technicians-Intermediate and Emergency Medical Technicians-Paramedic**

- (1) General Requirements for Certification of Emergency Medical Technician-Basic (EMTB) Training Entities, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic (EMT-P) Training Entities, Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate (EMT-I) Training Entities, EMT-B Continuing Education Training Entities, and EMT-P Continuing Education Training Entities.
 - (A) Each applicant for certification as an emergency medical services (EMS) training entity shall make application to the EMS Bureau and undergo a review by the EMS Bureau staff to determine compliance with these rules.

19 CSR 30-40.333 Application and Licensure Requirements for the Licensure and Relicensure of Emergency Medical Response Agencies That Provide Advanced Life Support

(1) Application Requirements for Emergency Medical Response Agency Licensure.

(A) Each applicant for an emergency medical response agency license or relicensure shall submit an application for licensure to the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) no less than thirty (30) days or no more than one hundred twenty (120) days prior to their desired date of licensure or relicensure.

19 CSR 30-40.528 Application and Licensure Requirements; Standards for the Licensure and Relicensure of Stretcher Van Services

(1) Application requirements for stretcher van service licensure—

(A) Each applicant for a stretcher van service license shall submit an application for licensure to the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Bureau no less than thirty (30) days or no more than one hundred twenty (120) days prior to their desired date of licensure or relicensure.
