NREMT REQUIRED TRANSITION COURSE

These requirements only apply to those providers wishing to apply for re-licensure in Missouri using NREMT certification. These requirements do not apply to those providers applying for re-licensure through the completion of CEUs.

The National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians is requiring all NREMT certified providers complete a “state approved” transition course. This transition course must be completed by March 31, 2015 if NREMT certification expired on March 31, 2011 **or** March 31, 2016 if NREMT certification expires on March 31, 2012.

The “state approved” transition program must be developed by the individual training entity, consisting of a minimum of four (4) hours in length, and following the guidelines listed below:

- 1) Introduction to the National Scope of Practice.
- 2) The National Scope of Practice for an EMT-Basic plus blood glucose check and 12 Lead EKG acquisition and transmission.
- 3) The National Scope of Practice for an EMT-I (AEMT) except for I.O. insertion.
- 4) The variance between National Standard Curriculum for a Paramedic and the National Scope of Practice for a Paramedic.

The training entity may incorporate this into continuing education programs or provide as a stand-alone training program. After successful completion this program, the training entity shall issue a certificate to each participant for their submission to the NREMT with their recertification materials. All records must be maintained as required by 19 CSR 30-40.331.

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
