



THE ROLE OF THE ADULT BRAIN INJURY PROGRAM SERVICE COORDINATOR

The Service Coordinator:

- Is your contact person for the Adult Brain Injury Program;
- Will gather medical documentation of your brain injury and any medical care you received after your injury;
- Will talk with you about how your life is going now, and what plans you have for your future;
- Will help you make a realistic plan for your future;
- Will help you identify other people to be on a team that can help support you in realizing your future plan;
- Will help you organize the steps needed to accomplish your goals;
- Will help you to locate and get services that you may need to become more able to manage your life;
- Will help make sure that any services you receive are started at the right time so that you get the most benefit from them;
- Will help make sure that the efforts of your entire team are coordinated toward your future plan;
- Will help make sure that any services provided are as close to your home as possible;
- Will meet with service providers or others to make sure you are still making progress on your goals, and give suggestions when indicated;
- Will be honest in telling you when you may need to adjust your future plan; and
- Will congratulate you when you have accomplished what you set out to do and no longer need formal services from the Adult Brain Injury Program.
- Will help you identify any additional supports to fulfill your long-range plans.
