

2022 Vulnerability Assessment: Washington County





Washington County ranked in the 5th quintile (114th out of 115 counties) for the opioid overdose vulnerability assessment and was in the 5th quintile (114th) for the bloodborne infection vulnerability assessment as well. In the opioid overdose assessment, Washington County ranked in the 5th quintile for 6 out of 11 indicators. For the bloodborne infection assessment, Washington County was ranked in the 5th quintile for 8 of 14 indicators, with the rate of drug-related arrests being the worst ranked indicator in both assessments. Social and economic factors were also included in these assessments, and the percent of the county's population without a high school education was its lowest rank followed by the rate of unemployment.
