SUBJECT: New Vital Records Certificate Paper – Registrar Update

Effective Monday, November 1st, 2021, all vital records certificate paper bearing the name of "Kenneth J. Palermo, State Registrar" will no longer be valid and should not be issued in any capacity. Any vital records certificate paper not issued by October 31st, 2021, should be properly disposed of by documenting the remaining beginning and ending paper ranges using the control numbers printed on the bottom back of a certificate and then securely shredding all remaining certificates. Please do not return any certificates to the Bureau of Vital Records.

Example: 11/01/2021 – Shredded birth certificate range 00100000KP to 00101500KP

Starting later this week, an initial supply (250-750 sheets each of birth and death) of new vital records certificate paper will begin shipping out to all local public health agencies who issue vital records. This supply of paper will contain the name of "Dylan R. Bryant, Deputy State Registrar" and should be used beginning on Monday, November 1st, 2021.

When full printing production is completed in a few weeks, every local public health agency that issues vital records will automatically receive one box (1500 sheets) of birth certificates and one box (1500 sheets) of death certificates. After these initial rounds of certificate mailings, normal ordering of vital records by request will resume.

Several months ago, new certificate paper (red, white, and blue) started replacing previous versions of certificate paper (green and white and blue and white). The newly designed certificate paper has a different alignment than previous certificates. Therefore, if you have not already, when you receive this new certificate paper, please contact the Bureau of Vital Records at 573-751-6387 to get your local printer settings updated over the phone. This must be completed before you begin printing on new certificate paper.

Note: If you have already switched over and are currently issuing on the red, white, and blue certificate paper, you do not need to call into the bureau again once you receive new certificate paper with the updated registrar name. On Monday, November 1st, you will simply be able to switch out the Kenneth J. Palermo certificate paper and replace it with the Dylan R. Bryant certificate paper.

As a reminder, both birth certificate and death certificate paper will now be the same general layout and color (red, white, and blue). However, they are separate documents and should not be mixed. Each piece of certificate paper for birth and death will be clearly pre-marked across the upper mid-section of each piece of certificate paper in bold font as follows: "Birth Certification" for birth and "Death Certification" for death.

Approximate Timeline

Friday, October 22nd, 2021 (Estimated)

Initial reams of newly updated registrar birth and death certificate paper will begin shipping for use beginning Monday, November 1st, 2021.

Thursday, October 28th, 2021

If you have not yet received any new vital records certificate paper by this date, please contact the Bureau of Vital Records at 573-751-6387.

Sunday, October 31st, 2021

Last day that vital records certificates bearing the name "Kenneth J. Palermo" may be issued.

Monday, November 1st, 2021

First day that vital records certificates bearing the name "Dylan R. Bryant" may be issued.

Wednesday, November 3rd, 2021 (Estimated)

One (1) box of new birth certificate paper and one (1) box of new death certificate paper will begin shipping to each local public health agency that issues vital records.
