Concurrently, as a result of changes in federal policy regarding National Disaster Medical Assistance Teams (DMAT) teams, which removed them from being local and state assets; in 2006, to a 501(c)3 non-profit charitable corporation to meet the State of Missouri's need for a disaster medical response team as state asset. At that time, the 501(c)3 corporation was incorporated under the name "Missouri – 1 Disaster Medical Assistance Team, Inc." or MO-1 DMAT, Inc...

At its founding in 2006, MO-1 DMAT, Inc. consisted of just a few members with limited equipment and supplies. At the beginning of 2012, MO-1 DMAT, Inc. will have grown to several hundred members representing medical and other professional disciplines coupled with an extensive logistical support system and equipment fleet housed in three strategically located warehouses throughout the state. Since its inception, MO-1 DMAT, Inc. has responded to numerous state level activations. As a result of its significant growth and expansion of its missions, MO-1 DMAT, Inc. has registered, and is operating under doing business as (d/b/a), the Missouri Disaster Response System, Inc. (MoDRS, Inc.).



Portable Morgue How to request it

If the County Coroner or EMD feels they may need assists from the State Mass Fatality Team contact the SEMA Duty Officer.

SEMA will then contact a MoDRS Mass Fatality Team Member to start the process of what resources will be needed.

Fatality Strike Team can be sent out to help with the evaluation process if needed.

Size Needed

Minimal size of 10,000-12,000.00 square feet

- □□ DPMU re-supply and staging area, minimum of 5,000 square feet
- □□ More square footage may be necessary for casket storage or other mission-specific needs

Current Statutes for Disasters

- Chapter 58
- Coroners or Medical Examiner may appoint a special deputy coroner or special deputy medical examiner in the event of any natural disaster, mass casualty, or other emergency situation.

Coroner Regional Caches

- Will be placed into 5 region within the State.
- Troop D,E,I,B and F.
- A,C,G and H will be covered by either Kansas City or St. Louis Regions.

Coroners Regional Caches

- Cost of 24,000.00 to help with the initial response to mass fatalities.
- Kit were composed of items that were recommended from the MoDRS meeting with Coroners in Branson, Mo in 2012.


