Yes, there are hospitals available in the area, but I can speak from experience that they do not provide the quality care and exceptional service that Mercy is known for.

Unfortunately, my family and I have had numerous experiences with the current health systems in the area that were less than ideal and nearly detrimental for my husband's life. Back in March 2021, my husband experienced a spinal cord injury at work and was unable to walk. We took him to a local hospital where he was admitted. They determined he was in need of an emergency Spinal Fusion surgery in his neck if he was going to be able to walk again. The surgery went well, but it was the days following that would cause quite a bit of heartache. Nearly 48 hours after surgery, my husband kept saying he wasn't feeling well. It seemed as though the care team wasn't listening to him. He began to experience shortness of breath and became unresponsive. They had to intubate him and place him in a medically induced coma in the ICU.

The next few days showed no signs of improvement, it was a very cold, empty place to be. I never saw a physician until three days later, when they told me there was nothing else, they could do and they had made the decision to transfer him SLU hospital. My heart was shattered and I did the only thing I could do that in that moment, pray. I immediately knew that transferring him to SLU hospital wasn't an option, I insisted that he be transferred to Mercy.

Upon arrival to Mercy Hospital St. Louis, the care he received was improved tenfold. The nurses and physicians worked feverishly to figure out what was going on and how to treat it. I was kept up to date on procedures, tests, and his care plan around the clock. I knew he was in the right place. It was difficult traveling back and forth every day and would have been so convenient if Mercy had a hospital closer to home. To this day, I still reflect on this experience and wonder how many other people have been in that situation. What if I didn't advocate for my husband?

What if I didn't have the ability to commute back and forth each day? More importantly, how many families have lost someone due to lack of quality health care?
