AWARD INFORMATION

Incorporation: In addition to the federal laws, regulations, policies, and CDC General Terms and Conditions for Non-research awards at <https://www.cdc.gov/grants/federal-regulations-policies/index.html>, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) hereby incorporates Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) number DP23-0010, entitled BOLD Public Health Programs to Address Alzheimer’s Disease and Related Dementias, and application dated March 23, 2023, amended, which are hereby made a part of this Non-research award, hereinafter referred to as the Notice of Award (NoA).

Approved Funding: Funding in the amount of \$450,000 is approved for the Year 01 budget period, which is September 30, 2023 through September 29, 2024. All future year funding will be based on satisfactory programmatic progress and the availability of funds.

The federal award amount is subject to adjustment based on total allowable costs incurred and/or the value of any third-party in-kind contribution when applicable.

Note: Refer to the Payment Information section for Payment Management System (PMS) subaccount information.

Financial Assistance Mechanism: Cooperative Agreement

Substantial Involvement by CDC: It is anticipated that CDC will have substantial programmatic involvement after the award is made. Substantial involvement is in addition to all post-award monitoring, technical assistance, and performance reviews undertaken in the normal course of stewardship of federal funds.

CDC program staff will assist, coordinate, or participate in carrying out effort under the award, and recipients agree to the responsibilities therein, as detailed in the NOFO.

The CDC will work in partnership with recipients to ensure the success of the cooperative agreement by providing technical assistance to the recipient through the availability of subject matter experts in ADRD, subjective cognitive decline, caregiving, and using the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) and other data to inform activities. CDC will also facilitate peer to peer sharing opportunities, provide technical assistance calls and webinars, and initiate calls/email communications for these activities as well as other technical assistance needs, as needed.

This also includes facilitating collaboration with other successful applicants funded through this NOFO, as well as organizations funded under CDC-RFA-DP20-2005 “BOLD Public Health Centers to Address Alzheimer’s Disease and Related Dementias”, and CDC-RFA-DP20-2003 “The National Healthy Brain Initiative” as well as relevant contracts and other projects.

Key Personnel: In addition to the Project Director identified in this Notice of Award, the application and work plan included individuals considered key personnel. In accordance 45 CFR Part 75.308, the recipient must request prior approval from CDC to change the following individual/position:

Budget Revision Requirement: By November 30, 2023 the recipient must submit a revised budget with a narrative justification. Failure to submit the required information in a timely manner may adversely affect the future funding of this project. If the information cannot be provided by the due date, you are required to contact the GMS/GMO identified in the CDC Staff Contacts section of this notice before the due date.

Indirect Costs:

Indirect costs are approved based on the negotiated indirect cost rate agreement dated March 16, 2022, which calculates indirect costs as follows, a Provisional is approved at a rate of 18.1% of the base, which includes Direct salaries and wages including all fringe benefits. The effective dates of this indirect cost rate are from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2025.

FUNDING RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS

Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) Restrictions:

- Restrictions that must be considered while planning the programs and writing the budget are:
- Recipients may not use funds for research.
- Recipients may not use funds for clinical care except as allowed by law.
- Recipients may use funds only for reasonable program purposes, including personnel, travel, supplies, and services.
- Generally, recipients may not use funds to purchase furniture or equipment. Any such proposed spending must be clearly identified in the budget.
- Reimbursement of pre-award costs generally is not allowed, unless the CDC provides written approval to the recipient.
- Other than for normal and recognized executive-legislative relationships, no funds may be used for: publicity or propaganda purposes, for the preparation, distribution, or use of any material designed to support or defeat the enactment of legislation before any legislative body the salary or expenses of any grant or contract recipient, or agent acting for such recipient, related to any activity designed to influence the enactment of legislation, appropriations, regulation, administrative action, or Executive order proposed or pending before any legislative body

- The direct and primary recipient in a cooperative agreement program must perform a substantial role in carrying out project outcomes and not merely serve as a conduit for an award to another party or provider who is ineligible.

Programmatic Restriction(s): Matching Requirement. This award shall provide from non-Federal sources, an amount equal to 30 percent of the amount provided under such agreement (which may be provided in cash or in-kind) to carry out the activities supported by the cooperative agreement.

Response to Weaknesses

A response to weaknesses listed in the Summary Statement should be part of the Notice of Award. The recipient is asked to submit responses to “Weaknesses” identified in the DP23-0010 Summary Statement to its program project officer within 60 days. The response should not go to OGS. Responses should be reflective only of the guidance identified and not a resubmission of the entire application.

Workplan and Budget CDC, Project Officer will provide feedback and technical assistance to awardees to finalize the work plan and budget post-award. Awardees will be required to submit a revised work plan and budget (if applicable) 60 days post award, using recommendations from the application objective review process and input from the CDC Project Officer and Evaluator.

Applicant Evaluation and Performance Measurement Plan With support from CDC, awardees must elaborate their initial applicant evaluation and performance measurement plan. This plan must be no more than 20 pages; awardees must submit the plan 6 months into the award, as described in the Reporting Section of the NOFO. HHS/CDC will review and approve the recipient’s monitoring and evaluation plan to ensure that it is appropriate for the activities to be undertaken as part of the agreement, for compliance with the monitoring and evaluation guidance established by HHS/CDC, or other guidance otherwise applicable to this Agreement.

Travel Funded grantees are expected to budget for travel for at least two representatives (per year) to attend a CDC-sponsored meeting related to the strategies being implemented as part of this NOFO.
