#### **AWARD INFORMATION**

Incorporation: In addition to the federal laws, regulations, policies, and CDC General Terms and Conditions for Non-research awards at <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/grants/federal-regulations-policies/index.html">https://www.cdc.gov/grants/federal-regulations-policies/index.html</a>, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) hereby incorporates Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) number CE24-0027, entitled Rape Prevention and Education, and application dated November 30, 2023, as may be amended, which are hereby made a part of this Non-research award, hereinafter referred to as the Notice of Award (NoA).

**Approved Funding:** Funding in the amount of \$773,517.00 is approved for the Year 01 budget period, which is February 1, 2024 through January 31, 2025. All future year funding will be based on satisfactory programmatic progress and the availability of funds.

  fiscal year for administrative expenses. This five percent limitation is in lieu of,
  and replaces, the indirect cost rate. Recipient can still submit and use an IDC
  rate as long as after calculations the total IDC is no more than 5% of total
  received in the fiscal year.
- An applicant may not use more than two percent of the amount received for each fiscal year for surveillance studies or prevalence studies.
- Amounts provided to applicants must be used to supplement, and not supplant Preventive Health and Health Services Block grant, other Federal, State, and local public funds expended to provide the activities described above.
- Funds may not be used to provide direct counseling, treatment, or advocacy services to victims or perpetrators of sexual violence (with the exception of hotlines). Funds may not be used for media or awareness campaigns that exclusively promote awareness of where to receive victim services.

**Programmatic Restriction(s):** Restrictions that must be considered while planning the programs and writing the budget are:

- · Recipients may not use funds for clinical care except as allowed by law.
- Generally, recipients may not use funds to purchase furniture or equipment. Any such proposed spending must be clearly identified in the budget.
- Other than for normal and recognized executive-legislative relationships, no funds may be used for:
  - o publicity or propaganda purposes, for the preparation, distribution, or use of any material designed to support or defeat the enactment of legislation before any legislative body

**Indirect Costs:** Indirect costs are approved based on the negotiated indirect cost rate agreement dated March 3, 2023, which calculates indirect costs as follows, a Fixed is approved at a rate of 20.80% of the base, which includes, direct salaries and wages including all fringe benefits. The effective dates of this indirect cost rate are from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024.
