ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AWARD

PURPOSE: Additional funding is being awarded for Notice of Funding Opportunity, **CDC-RFA-PS19-1901, “Strengthening STD Prevention and Control for Health Departments (STD PCHD),”** for the current **Budget Period 05.**

This Notice of Award also extends the current Budget Period from 01/01/2023 - 01/31/2025 to **01/01/2023 – 02/28/2026.**

The Period of Performance is extended from 01/01/2019 - 01/31/2025 to **01/01/2019 – 02/28/2026.** All funding is based on the availability of funds.

Total Approved Funding for this award is included in Summary Federal Award Financial Information on page 1 of the Notice of Award (NoA).

Expanded Authority: The recipient is permitted the following expanded authority in the administration of the award.

Carryover of unobligated balances from one budget period to a subsequent budget period. Unobligated funds may be used for purposes within the scope of the project as originally approved. Recipients will report use, or intended use, of unobligated funds in Section 12 “Remarks” of the annual Federal Financial Report. If the GMO determines that some or all of the unobligated funds are not necessary to complete the project, the GMO may restrict the recipient’s authority to automatically carry over unobligated balances.

Technical Review: Within 5 days of this Notice of Award’s (NOA) issue date, the Technical Review will be accessible to the recipient in GrantSolutions Grant Notes. Contact the assigned Program Officer indicated in the NOA with any questions regarding this document or any follow up requirements and timelines set forth therein.

Federal Financial Reporting (FFR SF-425): 45 CFR 75.341-Financial Reporting requires FFRs to be collected “no less frequently than annually”. Due to the approved extension, additional federal financial reporting is required.

- The recipient must submit an annual FFR within 90 days of reporting period end date 12/31/2024. The FFR is due 3/31/2025.
- The recipient must submit an annual FFR within 90 days of reporting period end date 12/31/2025. The FFR is due 3/31/2026.
- The recipient must submit a **final** FFR within 120 days of the project period end date of 2/28/2026. The FFR is due 6/28/2026.

Please be advised that recipient must exercise proper stewardship over Federal funds by ensuring that all costs charged to their cooperative agreement are allowable, allocable, necessary, and reasonable.

All the other terms and conditions issued with the original award remain in effect throughout the budget period unless otherwise changed, in writing, by the Grants Management Officer.

CLOSEOUT REQUIREMENTS

Recipients must submit all closeout reports identified in this section within 120 days of the period of performance end date. Closeout files are due **June 28, 2026**. The reporting timeframe is the full period of performance. If the recipient does not submit all reports in accordance with this section and the terms and conditions of the Federal Award, CDC may proceed to close out with the information available within one year of the period of performance end date unless otherwise directed by authorizing statutes. Failure to submit timely and accurate final reports may affect future funding to the organization or awards under the direction of the same Project Director/Principal Investigator (PD/PI). If recipients do not submit all closeout reports identified in this section within one year of the period of performance end date, then CDC must report recipients' material failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the award with the OMB-designated integrity and performance system (currently Responsibility/Qualification (R/Q) section of [SAM.gov](https://www.sam.gov)).

Final Performance Progress and Evaluation Report (PPER): This report should include the information specified in the NOFO and is submitted via www.grantsolutions.gov. At a minimum, the report will include the following:

- Statement of progress made toward the achievement of originally stated aims;
- Description of results (positive or negative) considered significant; and
- List of publications resulting from the project, with plans, if any, for further publication.

All manuscripts published as a result of the work supported in part or whole by the grant must be submitted with the performance progress reports.

Final Federal Financial Report (FFR, SF-425): The FFR should only include those funds authorized and expended during the timeframe covered by the report. The Final FFR, SF-425 is required and must be submitted no later than 120 days after the period of performance end date through recipient online accounts in the Payment Management System. The final FFR will consolidate data reporting responsibilities to one entry point within PMS which will assist with the reconciliation of expenditures and disbursements to support the timely close-out of grants. The final FFR must indicate the exact balance of unobligated funds and may not reflect any unliquidated obligations. Remaining unobligated funds will be de-obligated and returned to the U.S. Treasury.

Equipment and Supplies - Tangible Personal Property Report (SF-428): A completed Tangible Personal Property Report SF-428 and Final Report SF-428B addendum must be submitted, along with any Supplemental Sheet SF-428S detailing all major equipment acquired or furnished under this project with a unit acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more.
