All the other terms and conditions issued with the original award remain in effect throughout the budget period unless otherwise changed, in writing, by the Grants Management Officer.

**CLOSEOUT REQUIREMENTS**

All manuscripts published as a result of the work supported in part or whole by the grant must be submitted with the performance progress reports.

**Final Federal Financial Report (FFR, SF-425):** The Final FFR is required and must be submitted no later than 120 days after the period of performance end date through recipient online accounts in the Payment Management System. The final FFR will consolidate data reporting responsibilities to one entry point within PMS which will assist with the reconciliation of expenditures and disbursements to support the timely close-out of grants.
