AWARD CONDITIONS

Applicable Regulations: 45 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 75, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for HHS Awards.

AWARD INFORMATION

Note 1. The purpose of this amendment is to provide an **12** month No Cost Extension (NCE) to complete the Missouri's highest priority outcomes for the Zika virus readiness identified in the original Missouri Zika Virus PHPR work plan. The budget and project period end date has been extended from July 01, 2017 to June 30, 2018, as request in your letter dated March 31, 2017.

- Grantee will not be discontinuing any of the previously approved work plan activities
- Grantee extended their current contracts to align with the new period of performance
- Additional time is request to complete previously approved activities and to complete the project.

Note 2. All Zika funds should be used for the purpose of the grant program and align with the approved scope of work. For the current Non Research Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA): *CDC-RFA-TP16-1602*. Any proposed activities beyond the approved scope of work will require a prior approval request from the recipient to their assigned Grants Management Specialist and the PHEP Project Officer.

Note 3. Funding cannot be used for activities already covered by other Federal grants or cooperative agreements.

Note 4. Costs associated with the use of Zika funds to prepare for suspected or known Zika affected patients, including the development of action plans, purchase of supplies for public health activities, and training for all personnel are allowable expenses and must be approved by the program prior to use.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Annual Federal Financial Report (FFR, SF-425): The Annual Federal Financial Report (FFR) SF-425 is required and must be submitted to your GMS/GMO no later than 90 days after the end of the budget period. To submit the FFR, login to www.grantsolutions.gov, select "Reports" from the menu bar and then click on Federal Financial Reports.

The FFR for this budget period is due by **September 28, 2018**. Reporting timeframe is July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The FFR should only include those funds authorized and disbursed during the timeframe covered by the report.

Failure to submit the required information in a timely manner may adversely affect the future funding of this project. If the information cannot be provided by the due date, the grantee is required to contact the Grants Officer listed in the contacts section of this notice before the due date.

CLOSEOUT REQUIREMENTS

Grantees must submit closeout reports in a timely manner. Unless the Grants Management Specialist/Grants Management Officer (GMS/GMO) approves a deadline extension the grantee must submit all closeout reports within 90 days of the project period end date. Reporting timeframe is July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018. Failure to submit timely and accurate final reports may affect future funding to the organization or awards under the direction of the same Project Director/Principal Investigator (PD/PI).

All manuscripts published as a result of the work supported in part or whole by the cooperative grant must be submitted with the performance progress reports.

The final and other programmatic reports required by the terms and conditions of the NoA are the following.

Final Performance Progress and Evaluation Report (PPER): This report should include the information specified in the FOA and is submitted after solicitation from the GMS/GMO via www.grantsolutions.gov. At a minimum, the report will include the following:

- Statement of progress made toward the achievement of originally stated aims.
- Description of results (positive or negative) considered significant.
- List of publications resulting from the project, with plans, if any, for further publication.

Final Federal Financial Report (FFR, SF-425): The FFR should only include those funds authorized and actually expended during the timeframe covered by the report. The Final FFR, SF-425 is required and must be submitted to the GMO/GMS no later than 90 days after the project period end date. To submit the FFR, login to www.grantsolutions.gov, select “Reports” from the menu bar and then click on Federal Financial Reports.

Services’ Payment Management Services (PMS), you will be required to update your reports to PMS accordingly. Remaining unobligated funds will be de-obligated and returned to the U.S. Treasury.

If the final reports (FFR and PPER) cannot be submitted within 90 days after the end of the project period, in accordance with 45 CFR Part 75.381 (Closeout), the grantee must submit a letter requesting an extension that includes the justification for the delay and state the expected date the CDC Office of Grants Services will receive the reports. All required documents must be submitted to the business contact identified in CDC Staff Contacts.

Equipment Inventory Report: A complete inventory must be submitted with final PPER documents for all major equipment acquired or furnished under this project with a unit acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more. The inventory list must include the description of the item, manufacturer serial and/or identification number, acquisition date and cost, percentage of Federal funds used in the acquisition of the item. The grantee should also identify each item of equipment that it wishes to retain for continued use in accordance with 45 CFR Part 75. These requirements do apply to equipment purchased with non-federal funds for this program. The awarding agency may exercise its rights to require the transfer of equipment purchased under the assistance award referenced in the cover letter. CDC will notify the grantee if transfer to title will be required and provide disposition instruction on all major equipment. Equipment with a unit acquisition cost of less than \$5,000 that is no longer to be used in projects or programs currently or previously sponsored by the Federal Government may be retained, sold, or

otherwise disposed of, with no further obligation to the Federal Government. If no equipment was acquired under this award, a negative report is required.
