**Language contained in your original Notice of Award is revised as follows:**

**AWARD INFORMATION Incorporation:** In addition to the federal laws, regulations, policies, and CDC General Terms and Conditions for Non-research awards at <https://www.cdc.gov/grants/federalregulationspolicies/index.html>, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) hereby incorporates Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) number TP18-1802, entitled Cooperative Agreement for Emergency Response: Public Health Crisis Response – 2018 Opioid Crisis Cooperative Agreement, as may be amended, which are hereby made a part of this Non-research award, hereinafter referred to as the Notice of Award (NoA).

## **FUNDING RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS**

### **Financial Management Requirements and Exceptions**

1. Recipients are required to coordinate activities funded under this guidance with all other CDC-funded and federally funded opioid prevention activities to ensure alignment and reduce duplication. Specifically, recipients are encouraged to coordinate plans as applicable with the single state agencies for substance use disorder services in their jurisdictions.
2. Public Health Crisis NOFO activities are structured within the six domains listed below. Recipients are expected to align budgets and work plans with respective domains outlined below. The Department of Health and Human Services and CDC will provide ongoing oversight and monitoring of this cooperative agreement funding during the performance period.

### **Direct Assistance**

Direct assistance (DA) is not available through this cooperative agreement.

Overlap in projects, budget items, or commitment of effort

- Funds cannot be used for items covered by other federal sources
- Funds cannot be used to match funding on other federal awards.
- Unallowable Costs
- Research
- Purchase of naloxone
- Purchase of syringes
- Drug disposal programs (drop-boxes, bags or other devices, and/or take-back events) are not permissible under this funding opportunity
- Clinical care (except as allowed by law)
- Publicity and propaganda (lobbying)
  - Funds cannot be used for the preparation, distribution, or use of any material (publicity/propaganda) or to pay the salary or expenses of grants, contract recipients, or agents that aim to support or defeat the enactment of legislation, regulation, administrative action, or executive order proposed or pending before a legislative body, beyond normal, recognized executive relationships.
