Attachment 1 - Project Description

This assistance agreement provides funding for the operation of the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services' continuing environmental programs while giving it greater flexibility to address its highest environmental priorities, improve environmental performance, achieve administrative savings and strengthen the partnership between the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services and the EPA. This agreement funds statewide programs to address lead-based paint hazards. The work includes outputs and outcomes associated with managing continuing environmental programs which include activities to protect and maintain chemical safety. Activities to be performed with this project include: develop implementation plans to ensure that underserved communities and individuals have full, fair, and equitable access to the benefits of the state's programs; enhance partnerships with local governments and key stakeholders that represent or serve communities at risk for childhood lead exposure; increase outreach events and engagement processes in collaboration with at-risk communities and lead-safe coalitions to provide education on the importance of hiring lead-safe contractors, strategies for reducing exposures in children, and actions to support exposed children and their families; continue to reduce exposures to lead in paint by implementing standards for inspection, risk assessment, and abatement of lead-based paint hazards, along with training and certification programs; continue to implement regulations and other relevant authorities that require individuals and firms conducting lead-based paint abatement, risk assessment or inspection to be properly trained and certified, training programs to be accredited, and these activities to be conducted according to reliable, effective, and safe work practice standards. The anticipated outputs and expected outcomes are associated with managing continuing environmental programs which include reducing children's exposure to lead sources by identifying lead-exposed children and improving their health outcomes; communicating more effectively with stakeholders; supporting and conducting critical research to inform efforts to reduce lead exposure and related health risks; and activities to protect and maintain chemical safety. Direct beneficiaries of this program are the citizens of Missouri. No subawards are included in this assistance agreement.

Performance Reports - Frequency

Quarterly performance reports are required and are to be submitted electronically to the EPA Project Officer within 30 days after the reporting period (every three-month period). The reporting periods are **December 31, 2024, March 31, 2025, June 30, 2025 and September 30, 2025 of the project period.**

The recipient agrees to submit the **final project report** electronically to the EPA Project Officer within 90 days of the budget/project period end date of **September 30, 2025.**

B. Cybersecurity Condition

State Grant Cybersecurity

(a) The recipient agrees that when collecting and managing environmental data under this assistance agreement, it will protect the data by following all applicable State law cybersecurity requirements. (b) (1) EPA must ensure that any connections between the recipient's network or information system and EPA networks used by the recipient to transfer data under this agreement, are secure.

For purposes of this Section, a connection is defined as a dedicated persistent interface between an Agency IT system and an external IT system for the purpose of transferring information. Transitory, user-controlled connections such as website browsing are excluded from this definition.

If the recipient's connections as defined above do not go through the Environmental Information Exchange Network or EPA's Central Data Exchange, the recipient agrees to contact the EPA Project Officer (PO) and work with the designated Regional/Headquarters Information Security Officer to ensure that the connections meet EPA security requirements, including entering into Interconnection Service Agreements as appropriate. This condition does not apply to manual entry of data by the recipient into systems operated and used by EPA's regulatory programs for the submission of reporting and/or compliance data.

(2) The recipient agrees that any subawards it makes under this agreement will require the subrecipient to comply with the requirements in (b)(1) if the subrecipient's network or information system is connected to EPA networks to transfer data to the Agency using systems other than the Environmental Information Exchange Network or EPA's Central Data Exchange. The recipient will be in compliance with this condition: by including this requirement in subaward agreements; and during subrecipient monitoring deemed necessary by the recipient under 2 CFR 200.331(d), by inquiring whether the subrecipient has contacted the EPA Project Officer. C. Lead Program Recipient Attendance

Recipient agrees a representative will attend State and Tribal Lead-Based Paint Program meetings, training or workshops sponsored solely by EPA Region 7 or jointly with other regions. The Recipient understands that participation in training, workshops and meetings sponsored

by EPA is required and essential to the effective implementation and management of the Toxic Substances Control Act, Section 404(g) and Section 28 Lead-Based Paint Program.

D. Program Income

In accordance with 2 CFR Part 200.307(e)(2) and 2 CFR 1500.7(b), the recipient is hereby authorized to retain program income earned during the project period.

The program income shall be used in the following way:
