UPDATE ON THE WEBSURV, EPITRAX, AND ENVSURV REPLACEMENT PROJECT

ShowMe WorldCare will replace WebSurv, EpiTrax, and EnvSurv at the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS). Implementation is currently scheduled for June 10. However, due to scheduling of the CSTE conference as well as the level of customization being requested, DHSS and the vendor are reviewing timelines to determine if the implementation date should be moved. Any change to the implementation date will be communicated as soon as it is finalized. Currently, DHSS programs are documenting specifications for reportable conditions. DHSS staff along with LPHA representatives are exploring a TEST version of ShowMe WorldCare by entering test records, reviewing draft condition screens, and examining geographic boundaries. Regular updates on project progress and opportunities to assist (by reviewing design plans, testing, etc.) will be shared with LPHAs via the *Friday Facts* and other mechanisms.
