MISSOURI MASTER PLAN ON AGING -- STATEWIDE NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Did you know that within ten (10) years, older adults in Missouri will outnumber children for the first time in our history? In order to prepare for this aging population, Governor Parsons signed executive order 23-01, Missourians Aging with Dignity. Work has been happening on this plan since February 2023. DHSS has partnered with the Missouri Area Agencies on Aging to contract with Polco to develop a statewide needs assessment survey. Today we are excited to announce that Missouri is one step closer in the development of the Master Plan on Aging: Missourians Aging with Dignity with the launch of the Statewide Needs Assessment. The survey kicks off July 8! We need you to complete the survey and share the opportunity with all of your colleagues, friends, and family. We need as many Missourians as possible to complete the survey to ensure that their voices are heard in the development of the Missouri Master Plan on Aging. The survey takes about twenty (20) minutes to complete, but will give the state the information needed to ensure the plan will meet the needs and wants of as many Missourians as possible. We are all aging and are, or will be, caregivers in our lives. The Master Plan on Aging is being designed to ensure that Missouri can plan for the aging population. UPDATE ON THE WEBSURV, EPITRAX, AND ENVSURV REPLACEMENT PROJECT

ShowMe WorldCare will replace WebSurv, EpiTrax, and EnvSurv at the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS). The first implementation is scheduled for August 26, 2024, and will transition the three conditions currently in EpiTrax (COVID-19, MIS-C, and Mpox) into ShowMe WorldCare. EnvSurv conditions are scheduled for transition in October 2024, with the WebSurv conditions following in February 2025. Initial training materials have been shared with local public health agency staff with current access to EpiTrax or general communicable diseases in WebSurv. Individuals who only have access to EnvSurv or other WebSurv conditions (e.g., TB, Hepatitis) that are not transitioning until February will receive training information later. Regular updates on project progress and opportunities to assist (by reviewing design plans, testing, etc.) will be shared with LPHAs via the *Friday Facts* and other mechanisms. HEAT-RELATED ILLNESS RISK INCREASES AMIDST HEAT WARNINGS - A RE-PORT REMINDER

We have had and anticipate additional excessive heat warnings. In the last 5 years (2019 – 2023), 100 heat deaths have been reported to DHSS. Forty-seven of Missouri's 115 counties have seen at least 1 death associated with heat in those last 5 years. Some of the contributing factors that we have seen associated with these deaths include: cardiovascular disease (38), underlying medical condition (30), outdoor activity (30), illicit drug use (19), in a vehicle (13), alcohol use (8), homeless (7), occupational/work (6). The Bureau of Environmental Epidemiology (BEE) would like to remind everyone that all heat-related illnesses (hyperthermia) are reportable conditions under 19 CSR 20-20.020.
