Pathways: Missouri Public Health Internship Program

Providing internship opportunities is a great way to guide the future public health workforce, energize existing staff, and accomplish projects that have been delayed for too long. The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) in partnership with Missouri State University's Master of Public Health Program with funding from the CDC's Infrastructure Grant has established the Pathways Public Health Internship Program. Local public health agencies and DHSS programs can host students for an internship up to 320 hours (some students need fewer hours). Students will receive a stipend of \$20/hour upon completion of their internship while agencies will receive up to 320 hours of work from students pursuing degrees in public health, nursing, environmental health, or other disciplines. To participate in the Pathways program as a student or host site, follow the link below and complete the application: <https://health.mo.gov/living/lpha/internships/index.php>. Interested students can follow the link and apply to be considered for an internship. We are currently accepting applications from Students for the Spring 2025 semester until October 18. Agencies can apply anytime to be matched with students in future semesters. Selection of students and matching with agencies will occur in October. Agencies will then interview students; agree on duties, projects, etc.; and confirm a match!
