# SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ADMINISTRATION (SAMHSA) – HOLIDAY TOOLKIT

The National Alliance on Mental Health (NAMI) conducted a survey that found 64 percent of individuals living with a mental health illness experience worsened conditions around the holidays. Isolation, loneliness and stress can be difficult for anyone, especially those living with mental health and/or substance use disorders. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) provides a 24-hour-a-day, 365-days-per-year national hotline (1-800-662-HELP (4357) for individuals and families facing mental health and/or substance use disorders. This service provides referrals to local treatment facilities, support groups and community-based organizations. Be prepared for the hustle and bustle of the holiday season. #### **NEW RESOURCE GUIDE FOR MISSOURI FAMILIES**

Missouri families now have a new tool at their fingertips: a comprehensive resource guide designed to support parents and caregivers of children from birth to age 12. This guide, developed in partnership by the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) and LifeCourse Nexus Training and Technical Assistance Center (UMKC Institute for Human Development), provides descriptions, links and phone numbers of various statewide resources and is organized by types of supports which are categorized as discovery and navigation, connecting and networking, and goods and services.

While the guide is useful for all families, it was targeted to assist Missouri families of children with special health care needs and disabilities, highlighting Missouri Family to Family and the Special Health Care Needs Family Partnership. Both programs provide free statewide services and are staffed by parents or family members of individuals with special health care needs or disabilities.

# NACCHO -- 2025 RESILIENCE CATALYSTS IN PUBLIC HEALTH PILOT PROGRAM -- FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

NACCHO's Health Equity and Social Justice team is <u>accepting applications</u> for the **2025 Resilience Catalysts in Public Health Pilot Program**. This initiative, supported by funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), invites local health departments (LHDs) to participate in piloting tools designed to enhance community resilience and support health equity efforts.

NACCHO, in partnership with the <u>Center for Community Resilience</u>, is offering funding to LHDs to pilot one of two tools:

- Implementation Guide: Supports LHDs in implementing the Resilience Catalysts framework, including conducting root cause analyses, developing focus areas, and creating communication plans
- Evaluation Roadmap: Helps LHDs build evaluation capacity through tailored e-learning modules and guidance
