MODEL FOR ADAPTIVE RESPONSE TO COMPLEX CYCLIC DISASTERS (MARCCD) RELEASE

The Model for Adaptive Response to Complex Cyclic Disasters, or MARCCD, highlights our bodies' response to stress and trauma. Most of the time, we can absorb stress and regulate our emotions.

When stress is too severe, or when it lasts for too long, our normal coping skills may not be enough, and we can either be overwhelmed or shut down. In an under-regulated state, extreme stress can cause us to have extremes of anxiety or irritability, disrupted sleep, and leave us feeling distracted and overwhelmed. Extreme stress can also lead to an over-regulated state in which we feel numb or shut down.

Recovery requires an ability to work together. Anything we can do individually to move toward Adaptive Response will help us and our entire community recover more quickly. The second video of this 3-part series, <u>Understanding Stress and Recovery (Part II)</u>, is now available for viewing.
