But nicotine use undermines all the domains of wellness, including social, intellectual, and, critically, spiritual dimensions. Members of spiritual communities look to their peers and their trusted leadership for advice and support in fundamental areas of how they live their lives, including their health behaviors. At the same time, spiritual communities are interested in obtaining the resources necessary to fulfill their mission, which often involves tending to the safety, security, and health of their membership. Together these characteristics create the potential for powerful partnerships to reduce nicotine prevalence rates. The CoP is offered by the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services in partnership with the Missouri Department of Mental Health (DMH) and the Missouri Behavioral Health Council (MBHC).
