ADULT HEMOPHILIA TREATMENT PROGRAM

The Adult Hemophilia Treatment Program, established in 1975, provides assistance to Missouri residents who have been diagnosed with hemophilia or von Willebrand Disease. Services are provided to individuals 21 years of age and over who meet the eligibility criteria of the program. If you are not financially eligible for the program, service coordination is available to help you find providers of service for your condition.

Eligibility:

Applicants must meet both medical and financial eligibility guidelines. Medical eligibility is documented with a written diagnosis of hemophilia or von Willebrand Disease. Financial eligibility guidelines, implemented in 1992, are based on the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Poverty Income Guidelines at, or below, 185% of poverty. The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) is the payor of last resort. All third party payors must be utilized before DHSS will consider reimbursement. Applicants and program participants must apply for MO HealthNet (Medicaid) medical assistance and complete the application process to obtain or maintain program eligibility. Program Services:

DHSS will provide financial assistance for the following services related to the treatment of hemophilia or von Willebrand Disease:

- Outpatient Services, including, but not limited to, an annual comprehensive examination
- Inpatient Services
- Prescription Medications and Blood Factor Products
- Emergency Care
- **Home Medical Equipment** Approval for this service must be obtained through DHSS prior to utilization of services.
