- You have been raped or sexually assaulted. We can put you in touch with someone who will listen and help you cope.



- You know someone who has a developmental disability. We can connect you with services that provide assessment and case management for persons with developmental disabilities such as Down syndrome, cerebral palsy, head injuries, autism, epilepsy and certain learning disabilities.
