About Us

The Preventive Services Program (PSP) is dedicated to improving healthy smiles for all of Missouri's children through education and preventive treatment. The goal of PSP is to review Missouri children's oral health and provide a public health intervention called fluoride varnish.

Tooth decay is one of the most common chronic diseases of childhood. Untreated tooth decay can cause pain and infections that may lead to problems with eating, speaking, playing, and learning. Children who have poor oral health often miss more school and receive lower grades than children who have good oral health. Oral Health is an important part of general health.

The good news is that tooth decay is preventable. Fluoride varnish can prevent about one-third (33%) of cavities in the primary (baby) teeth.

Beginning of school or 6-8 Weeks prior to event date for steps 1 - 7

- 1. Read "About Us"
- 2. Watch the PSP informational video

Quick Guide for PSP Event:

- 3. Call with questions: 573-751-5874
- 4. Schedule the PSP Event Date as soon as possible.
- Secure ALL Volunteers Click the dropdown bar for "PSP Volunteer Information"
- 6. Ensure Calibrations/Trainings are completed.
- Print / Email / Add to website Oral Health Consent & Results Form to Parents with return date 5 weeks prior to event date <u>https://health.mo.gov/living/families/oralhealth/psp/pdf/Pare</u> <u>ntal-Consent-Form-English.pdf</u>

4-5 Weeks prior to event date for steps 8 - 11

- 8. Determine type of review form: Online with mobile device or Paper forms
- Order Supplies <u>4 weeks prior to event for children with consent</u> to participate (ordering open from July 1st to May 1st each year)
- Verify order upon delivery. Call with order issues immediately, 573-751-5874 or <u>oralhealth@health.mo.gov</u>
- 11. You / your school is required to provide gloves

Day of PSP Event for steps 12 - 16

- 12. Event Day: Print PSP Event Tracking Form; complete top of form
- 13. Set up event area: chairs, trash bins, table with forms & Sharpies or mobile devices, gloves, face masks & hand sanitizer
- 14. At event, give child their consent form to give to reviewer to complete with mouth review results
- 15. Collect results from review, clip bottom portion, send to parents for follow-up if needed

Within 2 days after PSP Event steps 16 & 17

- 16. Mail paper review forms within 2 days with coversheet. Click submit online forms immediately after event
- 17. Complete mandatory PSP Event Report
