






Emergency Medication and Policy Survey 2018 and 2023

- Survey link sent to 565 district lead nurses (including public, private, parochial and charter schools)
- Received 342 completed surveys from the 565 surveys sent to lead school nurses, yielding 60.5% response rate (2018 response rate 40.2%)
- Based on the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) defined school district county, responding school districts represented 106 counties and the City of St. Louis (93% of Missouri's counties) and 389,487 (43%) students enrolled in public school (Figure 1)




Emergency Medication and Policy Survey 2018 and 2023

- To better understand the degree to which school districts adopted and developed policies related to HBs 1543 and 1188 and other medical emergencies
- To identify implementation challenges
- To determine awareness of emergency medical services' response times
- To note any changes over the last five years




Do you have a medical director for your school district?




Does your school district have a policy to stock naloxone/Narcan in any of your buildings?




Does your school district stock naloxone/Narcan in any of your buildings?




Does your school district have a policy for stock albuterol in your buildings?




Do you have stock albuterol in your building(s)? (nebulizer and/or inhaler)




Does your school district have a policy for stock epinephrine auto-injectors/Epi-pens in your buildings?



Do you have stock epinephrine autoinjectors/Epi-pens available in your building(s)?




If you do not have stock emergency medications for asthma (albuterol) or life-threatening allergies (Epipens), (naloxone added in 2023) is it related to:

- No need or parent must supply emergency medication


Do you know the response time for emergency medical services if you have to call 911?




Other Reasons

Do you have policies for AED protocols and procedures?




Do you have AED(s) in any of your buildings?
