Ending of Public Health Emergency and COVID-19 Vaccines – What we do know:

- COVID-19 vaccines will remain available at no cost to COVID-19 enrolled providers and all
  eligible patients until the federally purchased vaccine supply is depleted or vaccine expires.
- We recommend all COVID-19 providers start the process of developing their own standing
  orders for COVID-19 vaccines in order to continue vaccination efforts. CDC created standing
  order templates for all COVID-19 vaccine products which can be found here by selecting the
  vaccine product your clinic is using and then selecting administration to find the correct
  template. Immunize.org also has developed some useful information on developing standing
  orders that can be found at this link.
- When commercialization becomes effective (Early Fall 2023) vaccine will be supplied through the existing channels until the federally purchased vaccine supply is depleted.
- After commercialization, once the federally purchase vaccine is depleted:
  - COVID-19 vaccine will be available at no cost to all enrolled VFC providers for VFC eligible children.
  - o Most patients will continue to have no out-of-pocket cost for COVID-19 vaccine.
  - COVID-19 is currently covered under Medicare Part B without cost sharing, which will continue.
  - Medicaid will continue to cover all COVID-19 vaccine without a co-pay or cost sharing through September 30, 2024. Thereafter, Medicaid will cover ACIP recommended vaccines which includes COVID-19.
  - Discussions continue on COVID-19 vaccine availability for underinsured and uninsured adults. COVID-19 vaccine will be available through 317 funding, however due to limited Adult 317 funding we are not sure how much we will be able to offer.
