What is the Readiness Assessment?

- Free and voluntary, online self-assessment tool provided by PHAB
- Non-obligatory to apply for accreditation
- Useful to assess and make informed decisions in key areas based on national standards
- Key in planning for accreditation preparation, but also useful in knowing more about your department

Do not distribute or copy. The PHAB Readiness Assessment is intended for health departments who are participating in the Readiness and Training process. Distribution outside of the health department is prohibited.

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The Readiness Assessment is based on PHAB's Standards & Measures for Pathways and Initial Accreditation



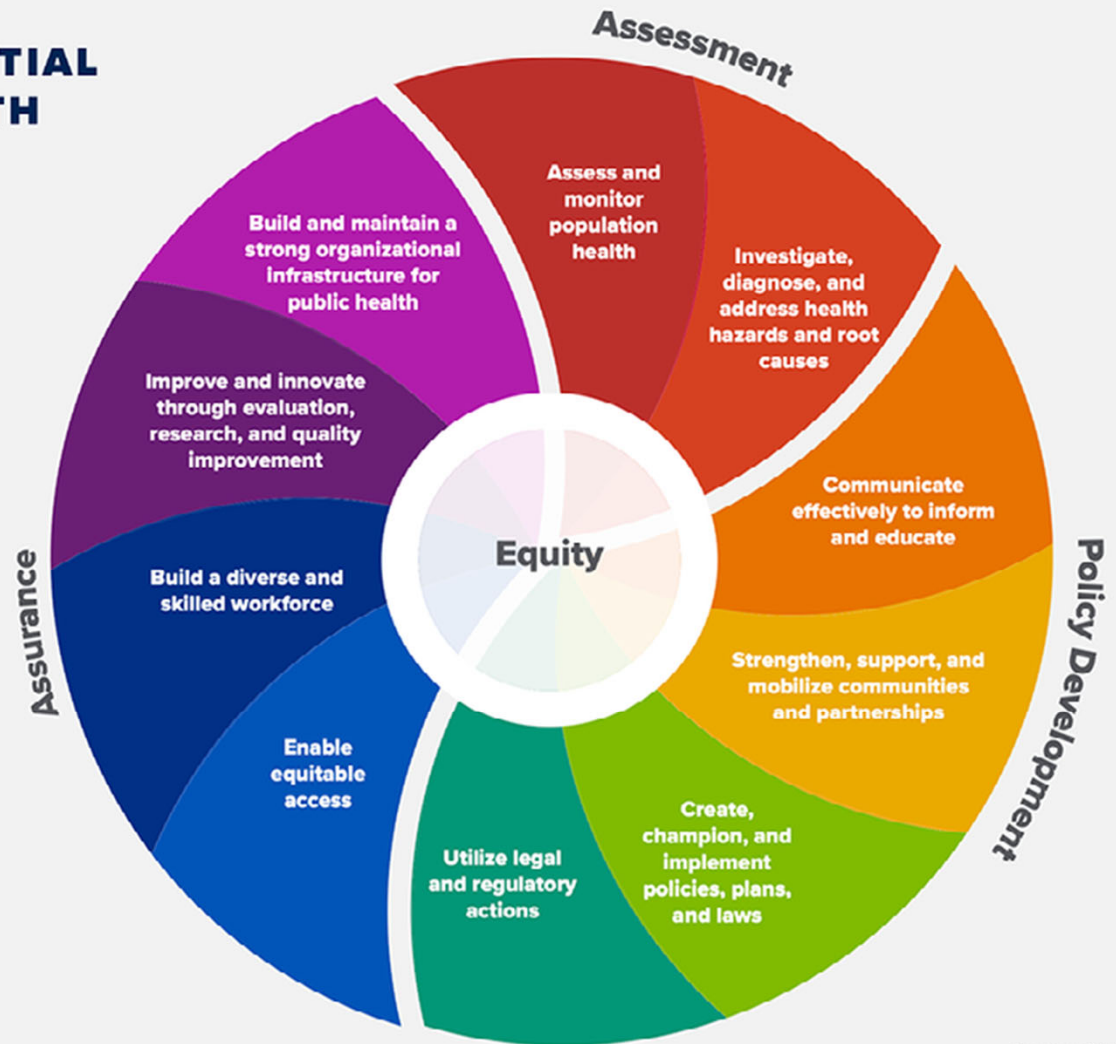

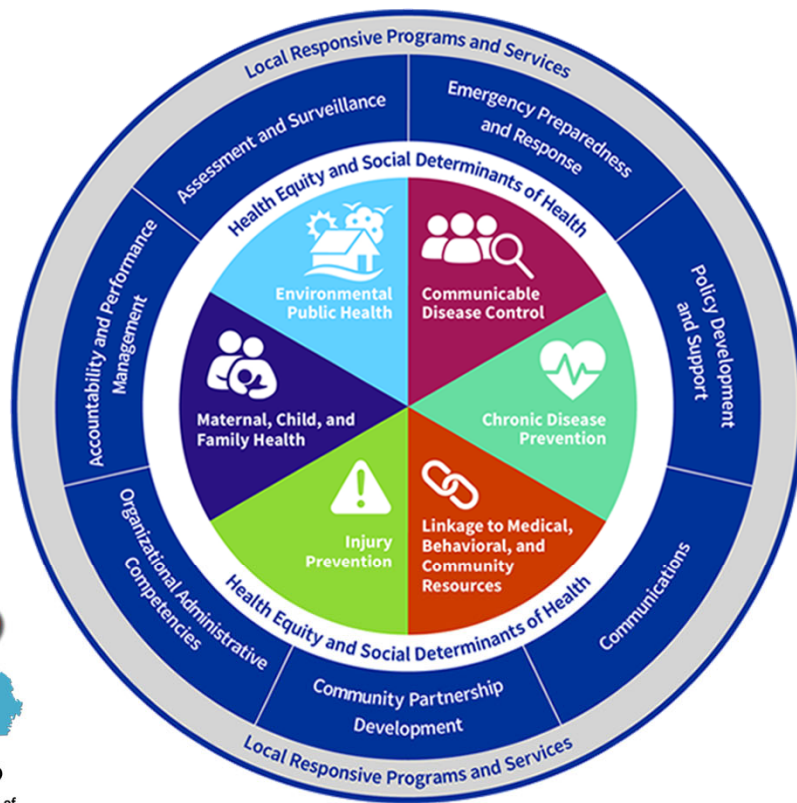

Everyone should have a fair and just opportunity to achieve good health and well-being.

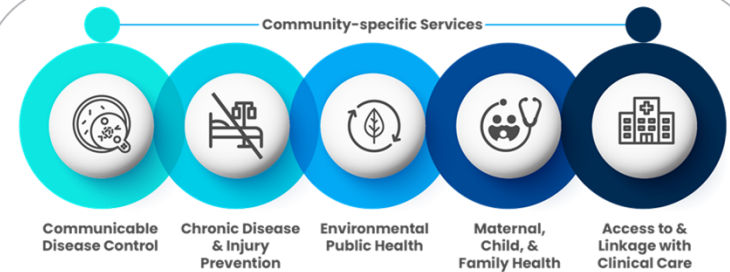

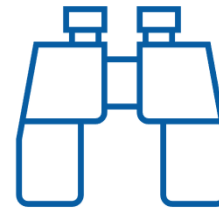

Become familiar with Standards & Measures



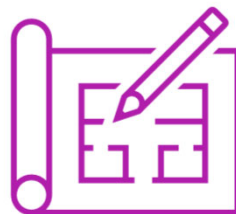
Identify strengths and opportunities for improvement

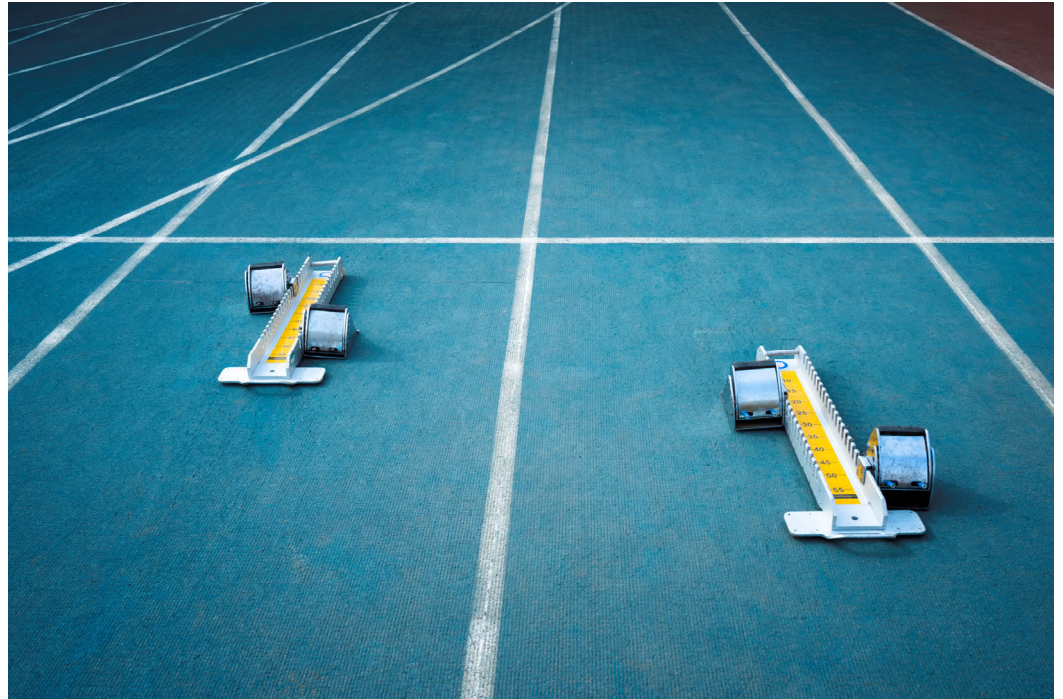


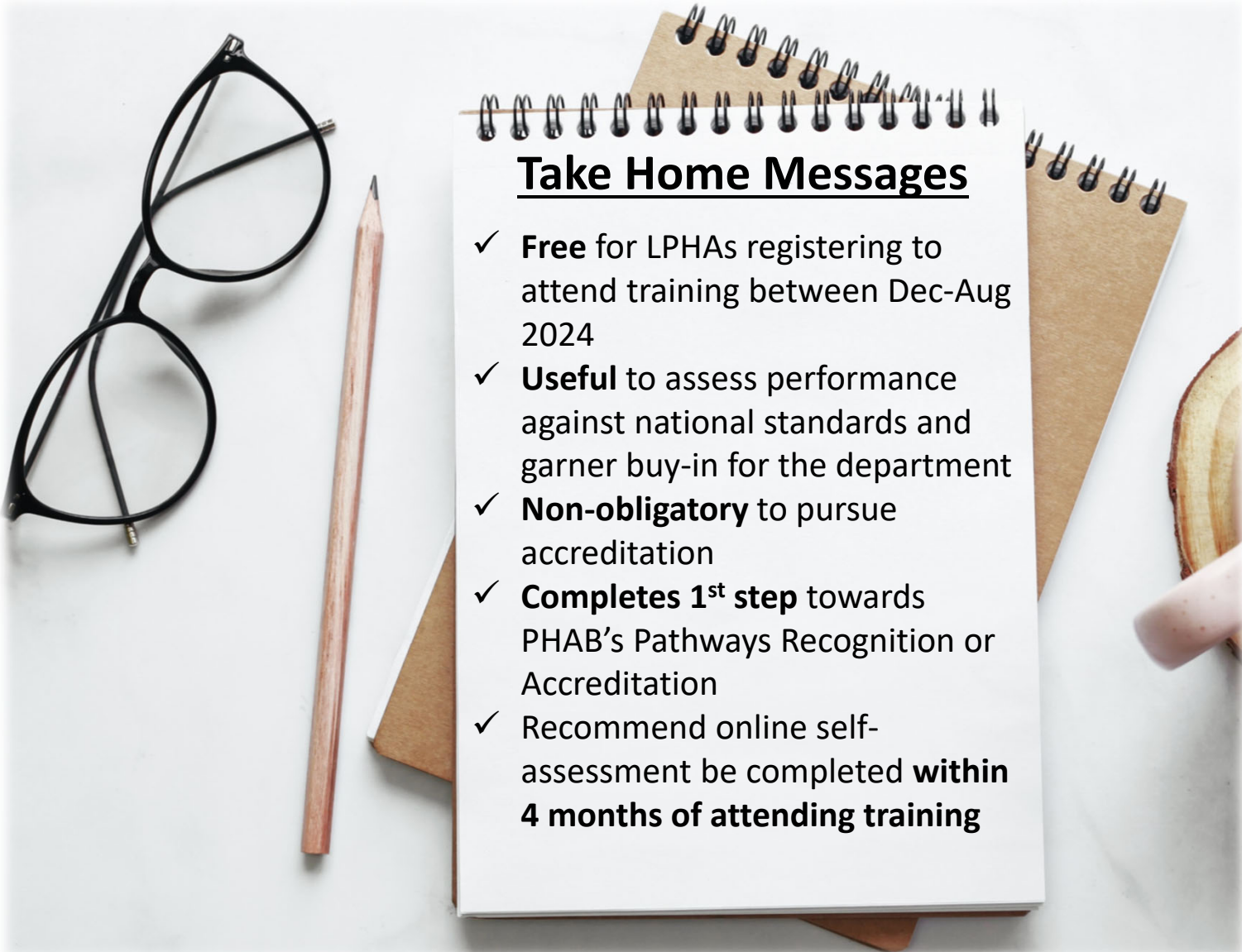

Take Home Messages

- ✓ **Free** for LPHAs registering to attend training between Dec-Aug 2024
- ✓ **Useful** to assess performance against national standards and garner buy-in for the department
- ✓ **Non-obligatory** to pursue accreditation
- ✓ **Completes 1st step** towards PHAB's Pathways Recognition or Accreditation
- ✓ Recommend online self-assessment be completed **within 4 months of attending training**
