


Screening Algorithm for Infants and Children Less Than 18 Years of Age with Possible Acute^{1,2} Zika Virus Infection (For use by DHSS/LPHAs only; not for medical provider use³)

²This algorithm does not include specific guidance regarding the evaluation of possible congenital Zika infection, including infants with microcephaly or intracranial calcifications, or infants whose mothers have positive or inconclusive test results for Zika virus infection.
