Sharon G. Humiston, MD, MDP, FAAP, Department of Pediatrics/Division of Emergency Medicine, Children's Mercy Kansas City; Professor of Pediatrics, University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Medicine

Dr. Humiston is Professor of Pediatrics at Children's Mercy Hospital in Kansas City, Missouri. She is a clinician and health services researcher; her research focuses on innovative and practical approaches to improve vaccine delivery. She works on HPV vaccination initiatives for the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Academic Pediatric Association and served on the Steering Committee of the American Cancer Society's HPV Vaccination Roundtable.

Dr. Humiston is the Associate Director for Research for the Immunization Action Coalition. She is working with Dr. Pahud (who will speak later today) on the development of a curriculum to help pediatric and family medicine residents communicate with parents about vaccine safety. Dr. Humiston previously worked in the Training and Education Branch of the CDC's National Immunization Program, now called the National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases.

INCREASING VACCINATION RATES: HOW TO TALK SO PARENTS WILL LISTEN, AND LISTEN SO PARENTS WILL TALK

Barbara A. Pahud, MD, MPH, Associate Director, Vaccine and Treatment Evaluation Unit; Associate Professor of Pediatrics, University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Medicine

Michelle Whitlock, Author: How I Lost My Uterus and Found My Voice

Michelle developed her keen sense of leadership, resilience, drive and survivorship early in life. She was raised in Silver Spring, Maryland. Abandoned by her mother at age three, Michelle and her two sisters were raised by her struggling single father. As a middle child, Michelle emerged as the leader and caretaker (with the help of her grandmother) for her two sisters and often her father.

During high school, Michelle watched as her father battled bouts of depression and drug abuse due to a serious injury he had suffered in 1986. Determined for a better life, Michelle began working her senior year. Her father passed away when she was just 21. Michelle remained the family anchor against the storm, while her sisters fell into the devastating clutches of addiction.

Michelle earned an Associates of Arts in Business in 1997 from Montgomery College. She went to Columbia Union College and graduated "Cum Laude" in 2002 with a Bachelors of Science in Organizational Management.

Michelle was busy climbing the corporate ladder, giving no thought to motherhood in late 2001, when at just 26 her world came to a screeching halt, she was diagnosed with cervical cancer.

Leonard Friedland, MD, Vice President, Director Scientific Affairs and Public Health, GSK Vaccines

Dr. Friedland is a pediatrician and research scientist who is passionate about vaccines. He spends his days helping people understand the science of vaccines and complex ideas about how vaccines help to improve public health and the lives of patients. He is also a licensed pediatrician in the State of Pennsylvania. Following a rewarding academic career in teaching and patient care, he joined GSK in 2003 to focus his efforts on vaccination and public health. Prior to his work at GSK, Dr. Friedland was Division Chief, Pediatric Emergency Medicine at Temple University School of Medicine. Dr. Friedland studied medicine at Mount Sinai School of Medicine in New York and conducted his residency in pediatrics at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and his fellowship in pediatric emergency medicine at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children, also in Philadelphia.

He has published over 45 peer reviewed articles during his career, and many book chapters on healthcare and vaccination topics. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics, the Alternate Industry Representative to the FDA Vaccines and Related Biologics Product Advisory Committee, and the Industry Representative Member on the Department of Health and Human Services National Vaccine Advisory Committee.

At GSK, Dr. Friedland is involved in the development of vaccines for use in children, adolescents, adults, the elderly, and pregnancy; including vaccines for the prevention of flu, meningitis, whooping cough, rotavirus, hepatitis, measles, RSV and shingles. He is privileged to be GSK's medical and public health representative and spokesperson for US vaccine topics at CDC, other public health venues, congresses, and media outlets.
