PACKAGING, LABELING AND PRODUCT DESIGN

How to Identify Regulated Marijuana Products in Missouri

The Division of Cannabis Regulation (DCR) requires regulated marijuana products to meet packaging and labeling requirements in **19 CSR 100-1.120**, as outlined below, to ensure all marijuana products shall be produced, packaged and labeled in a manner that protects public health and is not attractive to children.

Marijuana products are required to be in packaging that is resealable, opaque and certified as child resistant. All marijuana product packaging must be designed in such a way that required elements cannot be easily removed. Marijuana products and packaging must **not** include designs that are in the shape (or any part of the shape) of a realistic or cartoon human, animal or fruit.

Marijuana product labels **must** read from top to bottom, left to right and include the following:

- All ingredients (active and other).
- · Servings and doses per package.
- "Best if used by" date.
- The facility license number where the product is produced.
- The testing facility license number where the product was tested.
- The product testing tag number.
- *The source tag number, if applicable.
- *The standard barcode, if applicable.
- The exact total weight of marijuana in the package.
- The exact cannabinoid (Δ9-THC, Δ9-THCA, CBD, CBDA, CBN, THCV, CBDV and Δ8-THC) per serving/dose, listed in milligrams (mg),
 *cannabinoid percentage per package values including total Δ9-THC and total CBD (mg/serving-dose) (%).
- **Terpene analysis, if applicable.
- · Instructions for use.
- Estimated length of effect time per serving or dosage.
- DCR-issued product packaging approval number.
- *The strain name/flavor, if applicable.
- Standard warning: "Cognitive and physical impairment may result from the use of marijuana. Keep out of reach of children."

*Additional information that may be included by licensees.

**Additional information required if included in mandatory testing.

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Packaging approved by the DCR must have:

- A product label matching the provided example on the front of this page.
- The word "marijuana" clearly and conspicuously printed on the package.
- The universal THC symbol in red and white, with milligrams of infused products indicated directly under the symbol.

Packaging approved by the DCR **may** have:

- One main color for the entire package with up to two logos or symbols in any additional colors.
- The product name.
- Text indicating side effects and behavioral effects of usage.
- A QR code linking to a website where a purchaser can learn more about the

Public consumption of marijuana is not allowed. Article XIV does not permit driving or operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of marijuana. Consumption of marijuana product on the premises of a licensed dispensary, including in approved transport vehicles, is strictly prohibited.
