WAREHOUSING GUIDE

Warehouse Certificates

Per 19 CSR 100-1.140 cultivation, manufacturing, dispensary, microbusiness and testing licensees may store marijuana product offsite in warehouses. Licensees must apply for and be granted a separate certificate to operate each warehousing premises.

Only licensees that have passed a commencement inspection for a new license may apply for a warehouse certification. Once approved, warehouse certificates are associated with an existing facility license or certification; meaning warehouse certificates shall have the same expiration and renewal date as the license or certification for which the warehouse is being established regardless of when the warehouse certificate was applied for or awarded. Warehouse certifications are subject to annual fee requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.100(1).

Per 19 CSR 100-1.140(6)(D)3, transportation licensees <u>will not</u> be granted warehouse certification. Transportation licensees may only store marijuana product for purposes related to the transportation of that product.

Warehouse Premises

Warehouse facilities <u>may not</u> share space with any other licensee.

A dispensary license's warehouse <u>must be</u> located within the same congressional district as the dispensary license's facility.

Warehouse facilities must comply with applicable rules in 19 CSR 100-1; including, but not limited to:

- Security requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.090.
- Location requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.100(1).
- Signage and advertising requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.100(5).

Warehouse Operations

Prior to operation, a licensee must request and pass a commencement inspection for the warehouse per 19 CSR 100-1.030(3).

Per 19 CSR 100-1.140(6)(C)2, warehouse certifications are <u>only</u> authorized to store marijuana product; meaning:

- Warehouses <u>may not</u> process, repackage or fulfill orders for marijuana product.
- Warehouses <u>may not</u> purchase Metrc tags.
- Warehouses <u>may not</u> be the transporter between licensees.
- Warehouses <u>may</u> receive and store all marijuana product at any point in a product's lifecycle.

Warehouse operations must comply with applicable rules in 19 CSR 100-1; including, but not limited to:

- Employee training requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.080.
- Security requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.090.
- General operation requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.100(4).
- Reporting and notification requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.100(6).
- Inventory control requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.130(1).
- Transportation and storage requirements of 19 CSR 100-1.140.

Per 19 CSR 100-1.140(2)(B)4, 19 CSR 100-1.160(1)(A)6., 19 CSR 100-1.170(1)(A)6, and 19 CSR 100-1.180(1), marijuana product may only be transported between a licensee and its associated warehouse(s). A warehouse is only for offsite storage for the licensee, and may not be used as a distribution center.

- Marijuana product <u>may not</u> be transferred from a licensee's warehouse to another licensee's facility.
- Marijuana product <u>may not</u> be transferred from a licensed or certified facility to another licensee's warehouse.
- Marijuana product <u>may not</u> be transferred from one licensee's warehouse to another licensee's warehouse.
- Marijuana product <u>may</u> be transferred from a licensee's warehouse to the same licensee's separate warehouse.

Assigned Business Services Specialists and Compliance Officers communicate with the Designated Contact of the main licensee that the warehouse is associated with. The Designated Contact of the licensee must be aware of their responsibility to provide warehouse information, if requested.
