Overview of First Responder Trainer Responsibilities

During the Training:

- Ensure all participants fill-out the sign-in sheet
- Print out and bring required resources for training participants
- Emphasize that treatment resource cards need to be carried by all individuals who respond to overdose events and should be given out at the scene of an overdose event 100% of the time.
- Indicate that participants will receive a post-training assessment via email (from MIMH) following the training. Although the completion of this assessment is optional, it is crucial that these are completed to ensure sustained funding for the MORE project.

Post Training:

- Issue certificates of completion to all participants
- Submit sign in sheets to Karen Wallace and Phillip Horn. Please scan or photograph and email to Karen.wallace@health.mo.gov and Phillp.Horn@mimh.edu
- Complete the Training Summary Form. This is completed electronically through the link on the website.

Next steps for agencies to receive Narcan:

- After the training, each agency should contact Karen Wallace at (573) 751-6839 or karen.wallace@health.mo.gov.
- Each agency requesting Narcan will need to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS).
- Once the MOU is established, Narcan will be ordered and shipped. The first responder agency will receive an email notification of the expected date of delivery as well as where to pick up the naloxone.

Narcan re-supply following initial distribution:

- The grant will re-supply naloxone as long as there is funding available.
- First responder agencies should return to their specified pick up location to re-supply naloxone after administration.
- Completing the online overdose field report is required for each overdose response and Narcan administration.
