Legislative Subcommittee	Mark reported the subcommittee met this morning.
Mark Alexander, Chair	• FRA money sunsets this year so there are bills to have this renewed. FRA money is to increase by \$45.
	Personal Property Taxes funds 25-40% of EMS agencies. There are several bills filed to eliminate this tax,      There are sever
	phased out over time. There are no contingency plans to replace the money in EMS budgets. Others are concerned that the school districts are also very dependent on personal property taxes.
	The Wayfair Tax on line purchases would come from companies selling merchandise on the internet but have no
	stores.
	Money for Emergency Planning is sunsetting. Needs to be renewed.
	Balance billing for ground EMS may involve having any EMS agency run by a government (county etc.) can either
	publish their rates and that is what will be paid or the EMS agency can accept 325% of Medicare rate. Not
	allowed to bill further with either option. So ALS in rural is now capped at approximately \$400 for Medicare
	patents—so the 325% rate paid would be about \$1300.
	There is some difficulty with prior authorization being required by some insurance companies—EMS deals with
	a lot of emergencies and getting prior authorization is not practical nor prudent for the patient.
	SB873 has been filed to address TCD issues. The TCD Advisory Committee vote not to support the bill.      Bill regarding MILL Data and BEMS Data filed.
