




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Aged and Disabled Waiver (ADW)

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Aged and Disabled Waiver Services

- Homemaker
- Chore
- Respite Services
- Home Delivered Meals
- Adult Day Care

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Eligibility- HC, Chore, HDM, Respite, ADC

- 63 years of age or older
- Active Medicaid status
- Spenddown participants may receive ADW services during periods of eligibility and are responsible for the cost during periods of ineligibility
- Authorization of ADW services meets the requirements for Home and Community Based (HCB) Medicaid
- Have an appropriate ME code
- Meet nursing facility level of care


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Restrictions


- Individuals residing in a nursing or residential facility are **not** eligible
- Individuals residing in RCF, ALF or DMH facility are **not** eligible
- Participants who are Medicaid eligible due to blind pension are **not** eligible
- Participants who are in a Transfer of Property Penalty are **not** eligible
- Participants receiving services through any other HCBS waiver is **not** eligible

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Cost Maximums




- ADW services is included in the overall cost of care
- ADW services along with other Medicaid State Plan HCBS services, shall not exceed 100% of cost cap
- To exceed the cost maximum:
 - Review all unmet needs to develop PCCP and notify the PCCP Team
 - The case will be forwarded to Bureau of Long Term Services and Support for approval
 - Pending approval to exceed cost cap, services can be authorized up to 100% of the cost cap

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Chore

- Chore services are short-term intermittent activities needed to maintain the home in a clean, sanitary and safe environment
- Chore services may include any of the following activities:
 - Wash walls and woodwork
 - Clean closets, basement and attics
 - Shampoo rugs
 - Air mattresses and bedding
 - Spray for insects within the home
 - Provide rodent control within the home

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Medicaid Home Delivered Meals (HDM)

- Medicaid Home Delivered Meals (HDM) are to assist in meeting the nutritional needs of the participant
- Provides 1 to 2 meals per day
- HDM are aged and disabled waiver services **only**
- One meal is a unit

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Medicaid Home Delivered Meal (HDM)

- Meals are provided by Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) Senior Centers
- Maximum of two meals per day (for reimbursement)
- May authorize meals in conjunction with other HCBS

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Homemaker Services (HC)

- General household tasks provided for the participant as an alternative to nursing facility care
- State Plan services must be utilized before authorizing HC
- Exception to this can be made when participant has HCB Medicaid or Miller Trust also know as Qualified Income Trust (QIT) when other ADW services are not appropriate

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HC Tasks

- Meals/Dishes
- Make and change bed
- Clean floors
- Tidy and dust
- Laundry
- Iron/mend clothing
- Wash inside windows/blinds
- Trash
- Shopping/errands
- Essential correspondence
- Clean kitchen
- Clean bath

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Respite Care (RC)

- Maintenance services provided in the home to provide temporary relief for the caregiver that normally provides the care.
- Must have a designated caregiver
- Services shall include:
 - Supervision
 - Companionship
 - Direct client assistance

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Categories of Respite Care

- **Basic Respite** – The participant has a non-skilled needs who is not able to perform their ADLs
- The caregiver does not have to live with the participant
- **Advanced respite** services are provided to participants requiring a higher level of oversight and have special care needs
- The caregiver must live with the participant

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
Final Thoughts on Respite Care

- Additional services may be authorized on the same day as:
 - Basis Respite Care
 - Advanced Respite Care
- Additional services are not to be delivered at the same time Respite Care is delivered

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Adult Day Care (ADC)


- Services provided outside the home, for up to 10 hours 5 days per week that are organized, therapeutic, rehabilitative and social in nature
- Authorized - 15 minute units
- Includes:
 - Medical supervision
 - Medication services
 - Meals
 - Snacks
 - Transportation


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Adult Day Care (ADC)

The individual plan of care is developed by:

- Participant
- ADC personnel
- Participant's physician
