 - Need for transportation in rural areas for evening and weekends
 - Many systems have cut their services which make for long wait times or temporary suspended services – Major impact on lives from systems: now at a crisis level
 - Crisis level Driver shortage is a large issue

- Recommendations/Case studies for Rural Transportation
 - **1.** Mobility Coordination-Mobility Management Network: showing individuals how to use the system
 - **a.** For example: the public does not realize that systems like OATS exist. Perhaps a rebranding and more outreach to inform the public about the change.
 - **b.** Mobility Management Program Statewide One mobility manager per county would be ideal to assist with connecting transportation services
 - c. The mobility management services need to be in person not only technology based Call center. This established trust from people, especially seniors.
 - 2. Educational Resources to connect networks and rural neighbors, counties, and local municipalities
 - Joint communication and coordination efforts between the siloed communities: DHSS, DMH, DESE, MoDOT and more (all spend money on transportation) – Review how they can provide joint funding for connectivity in rural areas
 - 4. Statewide Transit Plan needed in Missouri: Example from Colorado <u>https://www.codot.gov/programs/yourtransportationpriorities/statewi</u> <u>de-transit-plan</u>
 - **a.** Boonslick RPC proposed a statewide transit plan in 2018/2019 and did not receive the funding

- Midwest Transit Conference Issues discussed/Solutions found
- Bus service between Jefferson and Columbia
 - 1. Examples provided from MO-KS https://ridekc.org/routes/P45
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 - Explore coordination solutions in each rural regions across the state
 - Jefferson Franklin county rural (Jefferson community action corporation) launched a volunteer driver transportation system, launched son May 15th. How many rides, just about 400? Mentored by Kelly Ast New Growth in Nevada, MO.
 - Struggling how to communicate with the hospitals and other organizations to help them best understand for referrals for transportation
 - The need to recruit more volunteers hard to get them to pass all the checks (3)
 - Turning down rides because there are not enough drivers to support the needs – tracking this information and the type
 - Funding original grant came from new growth supported by RCSPG program. Community service block grant. Also, private donations – local lions club.
 - Nancy Gade, Aging matters in cape Girardeau
 - Work with 4 provides, served 86,000 trips 60plus and handicap, smts oats, scott county, dunklin county

- Really rural many do not have wifi, so apps are not realistic. Did do commercials on local tv stations which increase rides? Marketing in a different way.
- Funding mehtap modot, state fuding through older American act
- Missourians for responsible transportation
 - Looking to partner with Mo complete streets and the MO transportation task force, to help push policy/plan
 - Long range transportation plan will be updates soon in the next few years, how to
 - Active transportation plan on moDOt specific needs list
 - Coordination between MoDOT multimodal and the planning division to coordinate with the master plan on aging and other coalition
 - If there were more opportunities available more senior would be getting out with proper infrastructure – collect data would be helpful
- Director of Medicaid reimbursement DMH Jennifer bax and wrin twenty
 - Provide transport per Medicaid or Mo Healthnet nemt programs
- Diviosn of developmental disabiliies DMH Wanda Crocker
 - Lack of available people to provide the service some large like oats and smts but they cannot find drivers which means we cannot deliver a service
 - Also, service provider of rehabilitation services. Not sure as a organized effort how transportation providers are increasing awareness to attract employees. For us we did value based payment with apprenticeship program – veterans can join and draw down their benefits for education at the same time
 - Is the transportation industry doing the same? Focus intentional effort to attract employees. How do we career option?
 - Look at doc partnership workforce program like other states
 - Funding as far as payment methodologies and rates. They will barter with others to get better pay or rates to support other programs. How to get equitable payments to stabilize the workforce?

- Love the idea of a NEMT representative transitioning between bides is nightmare, contract with more than one entity to have options and continuity
- Peer to peer state talks to learn about other NEMT
- Next steps for statewide coordinated plan and policy
