### PPEC GOAL

Enhance Medicaid services in Missouri by implementing a State Plan service that provides the opportunity for children with medical complexities to receive multidisciplinary care, including Private Duty Nursing (PDN), through an integrated day program setting.

## **Benefits** of PPEC



Enable parents and caregivers to work or attend school without the challenges of scheduling through a provider agency



Alleviate some of the critical shortage of nurses to provide PDN services, as nurses will be able to serve multiple children simultaneously.




Provide children with medical complexities the opportunity to thrive socially, emotionally and medically by receiving coordinated care through an inclusive day program setting

## PPEC Eligibility


- Missouri resident
- Age 0-6
- Meet PDN eligibility requirements, as established by MHN and authorized by the Bureau of Special Health Care Needs (SHCN) within DHSS through the Healthy Children & Youth (HCY) Program
  - Enrolled in MO HealthNet fee-forservice (FFS)
  - Require a four (4) hour block of continuous skilled nursing needs that can only be met by a licensed RN or LPN
- PPEC services ordered by a physician

The numbers on this map represent the approximate number children ages 0-6 currently receiving PDN.

### PPEC Reimbursement

- Prior authorization by SHCN RN Service Coordinators through the HCY Program
- Reimbursed through the Medicaid billing system
- Per diem rate for full (more than 4 hours of service per day) and half day (4 hours or less of service per day)
  - Current rate study under development to determine suggested per diem rates
  - As a medical service, PPEC services may only be billed when the child is in attendance

# Provider / Requirements

#### Licensure

- Must have an active DESE child care license prior to applying to be a PPEC provider
- Applications and oversight for PPEC licensure would be through the Division of Regulation and Licensure at the Department of Health and Senior Services
- Must be able to provide the included multidisciplinary services

#### **Provider Agreement**

- PPEC services are provided through MHN enrolled provider agencies
- Must have active provider agreement with Missouri Medicaid Audit & Compliance (MMAC)



## Staffing Requirements

- 1 Center Director
- 1 Director of Nursing (DON) DON cannot be the same as the Center Director
- 1 qualified designee available to assume the responsibilities of the DON when they are unavailable
- Licensed RNs or LPNs to provide skilled nursing services, based on staffing ratio
- Certified nursing assistants (CNA) or certified medical technicians (CMT) to provide unskilled direct care services, based on staffing ratio
- Licensed Physical, Occupational and Speech Therapists to provide PT, OT and ST services
