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Find help with the cost of medicine

Be on the Alert for NeedyMeds Look-Alikes

Consumers — be on the alert!

There are websites that claim to help people apply to prescription assistance programs. Some are reputable, but many are not. And you never need to use any of these services you can do it all yourself at no cost.

Some of these sites imply they are NeedyMeds. Don't be fooled — NeedyMeds never charges for our information or help. Visit our website at www.needyeds.org (don't forget the "s" in NeedyMeds). You can also call our toll-free helpline at 800-503-6897.

Here are some warning signs of potential scams:

1. The program makes outlandish promises: For example, the company claims it can get you any medicine or all your medicines for free. That just isn't the truth.
2. They want your checking account information: Always pay by credit card (not debit card) because your credit card company can help you if you are ripped off.
3. If you can't get a real person who is kind and compassionate on the phone, then be suspicious: Fast talking salespeople are not there to help you — they are there to take your money.
4. Unanswered questions: If the program won't answer your questions to your satisfaction, then suspect a scam. For example, one program declared they gave part of their profits to a non-profit but would never say which non-profit.
5. The fees are larger than their competition: These programs are there to make a profit, and that's not unreasonable. However, shop around and make sure you aren't paying a lot more than other services charge.
6. They don't have a street address: Many companies use a post office box, but they should have a physical location. If you can't find one, then be wary.
7. Check with the Better Business Bureau: This isn't a guarantee the company is legitimate, but it can help. A lot of complaints is a red flag.
8. Do an online search for the company's name: See if you find a lot of complaints. If so, watch your step.
9. They claim you have to use a company to help you apply: Most applications to PAPs are sent by the patients to the program directly with no assistance from any company. It's really not that hard to do it all yourself.
10. They claim to have special knowledge or can get the medication to you faster: There is no special knowledge about these programs; it's all on our website. PAPs don't give priority to applications sent in by these companies.

Patient: Simply present this card to a participating pharmacy to receive a discount on your prescription. Patients who have Medicare, including Part D, Medicaid or any state or federal prescription insurance can only use this card if they choose not to use their government-sponsored drug plan for their purchase. What if I have insurance?

Anyone can use the card, but it can't be combined with insurance.

You can use the card instead of insurance if:

- A drug isn't covered by your insurance
- Your insurance has no drug coverage
- You have a high drug deductible
- You have met a low medicine cap
- The card offers a better price than your copay
- You are in the Medicare Part D donut hole

What drugs are covered?

The card is good for prescription drugs, over-the-counter medicines and medical supplies if written on a prescription blank, and pet prescription medicines purchased at a pharmacy. You'll save on most, but not all, prescriptions.

The card is not valid in combination with other insurance plans, including Medicare, Medicaid or any state or federal prescription insurance.

The card can be used only if you decide not to use your government-sponsored drug plan for your purchases.
